

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Hope you have been enjoying this cooler weather. God blesses us in so many ways. I hope that all of us are able to see those blessings and to recognize that they come to us from a loving and caring God. Last month on Respect Life Sunday I preached about the effects of oral contraceptives and its link to cancer. The article may be found here: www.iarc.fr/en/media-centre/pr/2005/pr167.html It says that COMBINED ESTROGEN-PROGESTOGEN CONTRACEPTIVES AND MENOPAUSAL THERAPY ARE CARCINOGENIC TO HUMANS. It puts The Pill on the same level of a cancer causing agent as asbestos (Group 1). That is very frightening as millions of women have taken this pill sometime in their life and have had cancer. It also makes me wonder what it does to the children whom they conceived after they quit taking the pill or during the time they took it and it failed. Something to think about.

If you have not voted yet, please do so on Election Day, Tuesday. Vote for those candidates that best represent Catholic teaching in regards to Pro-life issues, such as abortion, birth control, death penalty, the poor and the needy. Vote for the candidates that will protect our religious freedoms. Vote for the candidates that support traditional marriage. Vote for the candidates that are willing to speak and listen to the Catholic Church in regards to these issues and for those who seek to have a good mutual relationship with the Catholic Church. Be sure to pray for all who have yet to vote, may they seek the wisdom of God.

Next Sunday, November 11, is Veteran's Day. Please pray for all veterans who have served our country by serving in the Armed Forces.

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us the two great commandments: Love God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength. And, love your neighbor as yourself. Jesus takes the first commandment from the Book of Deuteronomy as we read in today's first reading. He adds the second one to it because it is the fulfilling of the last seven of the Ten Commandments. Jesus was well aware of how the religious leaders and most of the people treated those who were ill and poor. Jesus was also aware of how they did not really love God as they should. He is telling them that loving God and loving neighbor are equally important. You cannot say you love God while neglecting to love your neighbor. All of us need to remember this as we approach the Altar and receive the Body and Blood of Jesus in Holy Communion. May we see everyone as our neighbor, as our brother and sister, and love them as God loves them.

During the month of November, we pray for all who have died, especially the souls in Purgatory. Here is a little reflection that I found quite interesting:

Den smutku, den tiché radosti. Takto můžeme charakterizovat památku věrných zemřelých. Smutek, protože si připomínáme odchod našich blízkých. Tichá radost, protože tento odchod není definitivní: Kristus má totiž dost moci nás znovu shromáždit... V tomto dni jsou tedy protknuty naděje a bolest.

Není třeba dlouho rozebírat důvody našeho smutku - ty jsou samozřejmé. Méně samozřejmé jsou však důvody naší "plaché" radosti. Je možné totiž namítnout: Nezlehčujeme touto radostí vážnost smrti? Nezavíráme oči před skutečností, že ti naši blízcí už tu nejsou? Na tyto námitky odpovídáme, že bereme vážně jak realitu smrti, tak i realitu... že smrt podlehla smrti! V Kristu je i smrt našich blízkých přemožena. Jistě, toto zatím nevidíme - máme jen oči víry. A právě tato víra nám dává vidět to, co není lidským očím zatím viditelné. Pokud Kristus vstal z mrtvých, tak vstal právě proto, aby ti, kteří zemřeli v jeho společenství, povstali ze smrti k životu.

Avšak tato cesta ze smrti k životu je někdy delší. A proto se dnes modlíme ke Vzkříšenému Kristu, aby naše zemřelé sestry a bratry dovedl k sobě. Naše modlitba je tak pro ně jakýmsi občerstvením a osvěžením na náročné cestě. Těmto svým drahým můžeme podat pomocnou ruku! A to je právě to úžasné - nemusíme zůstat u bolesti, ale s radostí můžeme vykonat pro ně něco prospěšného.

Tuto modlitbu však nemáme chápat tak, že bychom chtěli naklonit přísného Boha, aby už "konečně" prokázal milosrdenství. Jak bychom si vůbec mohli představit, že bychom byli "dobrotivější" než ten, který je dobro samo? Naše dobrotivost (projevená v modlitbě) je spíš podílem na Boží dobrotě. Ba dokonce - Bůh je tak dobrý a chce nás natolik poctít, že nás činí svými spolupracovníky v díle milosrdenství. On by to mohl vykonat bez nás... ale on chce s námi, aby nám udělal větší radost, že smíme pomáhat těm, které máme doposud rádi. A proč tedy neusilovat o to, aby rostla radost naše - a těch zesnulých, za které se modlíme? (From Pastorace.cz)
