

Dear friends in Christ.

"All praise and glad thanksgiving to God the Father be." This is the opening line of the hymn of the same name. We have just celebrated Thanksgiving Day and here we are in this Thanksgiving weekend. I hope all of you have had a wonderful time with your family and friends. It is a special time of the year. Are you really filled with thanksgiving to God for all that you have?

Today we celebrate the great feast of Christ the King and the end of our Church Liturgical Year. Next Sunday, we will begin the season of Advent. During the year, we celebrate the entirety of the life of Jesus, from the time he is conceived in the womb of Mary to the time of His death, resurrection and ascension into heaven, where He reigns as King, seated on the throne as we read in the Book of Revelation. Most of the year, we focus upon Jesus' public ministry and His daily activities. We are reminded that Jesus is with us as He ministers to us through His Church, through the Sacraments, through the Scriptures, through our life of prayer, and through other people. All we have to do is to submit ourselves to Him. This is difficult to do in today's world. Most people have been taught that they should only submit to their own opinions and ideas, they become the only source of authority and no one can tell them what to do. Also, they submit themselves to public opinion or the opinion of their friends and family. This is completely contrary to the teachings of Jesus. If He is to help us in this life, we must submit ourselves to Him and Him alone and allow ourselves to be guided by the Church which He established. This takes great humility on our part. Is Jesus really the King of Kings and Lord of Lords in your life? Pray the following prayer together with your family and dedicate your family to Jesus Christ our King.

Act of Dedication of the Human Race to Jesus Christ the King

Loving Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us as we kneel before you on this feast day. We belong to you and we wish always to be yours. In order that we may be more closely united with you, each one of us freely consecrates ourselves today to your most Sacred Heart.

We pray, Lord, that you will be king, not only of the faithful ones who have never abandoned you, but that you will be King also of those who have abandoned the faith. We pray especially for them, that they may soon return to their Father's house and to their Father's love.

We pray also that you will be King of those who are kept away from the church because of false opinions or misunderstandings. Call them back, Lord, to the truth and unity of the faith, so that soon there may once again be one flock and one Shepherd.

Grant to your Church, Lord, assurance of freedom and immunity from harm. We pray for peace and tranquility among all the nations of the world. May all peoples praise your divine Heart which has loved us and saved us. To you be glory and honor forever. Amen.

Is God the One who really reigns in your life? Here is a little meditation to reflect upon: Že by Ježíš byl skutečně králem? Tváří v tvář nemoci a vlastní bezmocnosti – je Ježíš králem?, ptáme se nejistě. Tváří v tvář zprávám o "nezastavitelné" moci zla, o atentátech a vraždách – je Ježíš schopný něco udělat? Tváří v tvář vlastní životní krizi, když se hroutí dosavadní jistoty a nevíme, kudy dál – je Ježíš pánem situace? Tváří v tvář úzkostnému hledání ekonomického zabezpečení pro sebe a pro své nejbližší – je Ježíš budoucností? Tváří v tvář svým selháním – je Ježíš mocnější? Dřív nebo později býváme konfrontováni s takovými otázkami. Odpověď není samozřejmá... Ježíš totiž není tím "supermanem", kterého vídáváme v různých filmech (a který se rázně vypořádá se zlými lidmi). On opravdu není "rambo", ba ani "kouzelník", který mávnutím proutku změní nepříjemnou situaci. Toto jsme už asi mohli za svůj život poznat. Ale možná nám chybí jiná zkušenost, daleko důležitější – že Ježíš je opravdu mocným pánem, navzdory různým nepříznivým událostem. V jakém smyslu? V tom smyslu, že jemu se nic nevymyká z rukou, že on zůstává "nad tím" – a má moc "z toho" vytáhnout.

Kdykoli se budeme nacházet v situaci, že budeme tonout a klesat v bahnitých vodách, volejme k němu. Možná nezažijeme, že by se naše zadlužená firma nerozpadla, ale zažijeme něco důležitějšího – že náš život stojí na Kristu – a ne na těch "jistotách", jak si ve své krátkozrakosti myslíme. Možná zažijeme, jak Ježíš nás ubezpečí, že život v plnosti je před jeho tváří. A možná vytušíme, že náš život nespočívá v tom, že budeme zdraví a finančně zabezpečení – ale že známe Otce a že náš život patří jemu. Toto poznání Otce je tím největším kapitálem...
