

Merry Christmas! Everything was certainly beautiful for our Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses. I would like to thank those who decorated the churches, led us in singing, sang in the choir, played the organ or other instruments and helped out in any way to make our Christmas Masses so beautiful. Thank you for your commitment and dedication to your parish and to our Lord and thank you for helping us to give a fitting celebration for His birthday.

I would also like to thank all of you for the cards, gifts and tasty treats that I received from you for Christmas. You are truly a very generous and loving people.

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. How do our families compare to the Holy Family? Do we seek God's guidance in all of our family activities and decisions? Do we try to be holy by praying, going to church together every week, being forgiving of one another and reading Scripture together? Let us try to make every family a holy family of God. Here is a little reflection on today's Gospel from Don Schwager of www.dailyscripture.net: "Like all godly parents, Joseph and Mary raised the child Jesus in the fear and wisdom of the Lord. Joseph was given a unique task as the guardian and protector of Mary and of Jesus. What can we learn from the example and witness of Joseph? Joseph is a man of God, a man of unquestioning obedience and willing service. He is a man of prayer and a man of God's word. Through faith he recognized the hand of God in the mystery of the Incarnation — the Son of God taking flesh as the son of Mary. Joseph is a man of action, diligent in the care of his family and ready to do the Lord's bidding. Joseph fearlessly set aside his own plans when God called him to "take to the road" and to leave his familiar surroundings — his home, friends and relatives, and the security of his livelihood in order to pursue a hidden mission God entrusted to him as the guardian of the newborn King. God has a plan for each of us. With the plan God gives grace and the assurance of his guiding hand and care. Do you trust Him for his plan for your life? Are you willing to sacrifice your own plans for God's plan? Are you willing to give God unquestioning service and to pursue whatever mission he gives you?"

This week we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. This is a Holy Day of Obligation, so let us join together to honor our Blessed Mother, to thank her for being the mother of God, Jesus, and to ask her to pray for us.
