### Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! We have just completed our first full week of Ordinary Time. Has this been an ordinary week for you, or, have you allowed Jesus to make it an *extra*ordinary week in your life of faith?

Tuesday, January 22, is the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. We all need to pray that babies in the wombs of their mothers will be protected from being killed. This is one of the most horrendous atrocities of our time. Yet, many people think it is ok. We live in a crazy and confused world. Please try to attend Mass on Tuesday to pray that people may have change of heart and mind, and that they will all work together to love and protect these babies. If you are unable to come to Mass on Tuesday, try to stop by the church sometime during the day to say a prayer for the protection of the unborn.

This week, we celebrate the feast day of many saints. These include St. Agnes on Monday; St. Vincent and St. Marianne Cope on Wednesday; St. Frances de Sales on Thursday; The Conversion of St. Paul on Friday; and, Ss. Timothy and Titus on Saturday. The letters of Timothy and Titus in the Bible are very important in giving us information about the early Church, especially in regard to Bishops, Priests and Deacons. Read these letters and you will be amazed.

This Sunday's Gospel is taken from the Gospel of John 2:1-11. It is the story of the Wedding Feast at Cana, where Jesus changes the water into wine. This is considered another epiphany moment in the life of Jesus. Jesus reveals to those around Him and to the world that God is with Him and that, through Him, God can do the seemingly impossible. There are many aspects to focus upon in this Gospel. One is Jesus' concern for this newly married couple. He assists them so that they will not be embarrassed for running out of wine for their guests. Not having enough wine would have brought shame upon the couple and their family. So, Jesus makes more wine out of water. Notice that it is the best quality of wine. This is the first of Jesus' miracles in John's Gospel. Also, Jesus does this miracle at Mary's urging him to do so. She intercedes for this couple to her Son and, after a little hesitation, Jesus does what Mary asks Him to do. Mary continues to intercede for you and me whenever we ask her for assistance and prayers. Ask her to pray for you and your needs often. As we reflect upon Jesus changing the water into wine, we see that there is a connection to the Eucharist in which Jesus changes ordinary bread and wine into His Body and Blood. He does this at every Mass throughout the world. Many say that this is impossible, but, when you look at Jesus' life and all the miracles He did, and still continues to do in the world, then it is not so impossible a task to change bread and wine into His Body and Blood. After all, He did this at the Last Supper and asked the Apostles to do the same. He continues to give us this gift and will continue to do so until He comes again.

Here is a reflection on today's Gospel:

Pouhá voda... nevýrazná, bez chuti. Dobrá sice k tomu, aby uhasila žízeň, aby zachovala a udržovala při životě, ale nevhodná k slavení. Voda, která nemůže naplnit radostí, rozjasnit tvář člověka. Avšak tato voda je dost dobrá k tomu, aby si ji Ježíš použil – a projevil se jako dárce pravé radosti. Jako ten, kdo překvapí... když už člověk nic neočekává a prožívá nevýraznou šeď (ani hosté na svatbě, ani správce neočekávali tak skvělé víno tak pozdě – měli za to, že to "lepší už měli za sebou"). S Kristem... to lepší teprve přichází... a má přijít.

Kána se může stát skutečností i v našem životě. Pijeme jen "průměrné víno", či dokonce pouhou vodu? Život nás nebaví, protože pijeme jen "nevýraznou vodu bez chuti"? Pak ale nezapomeňme, že i Kristus je přítomný, je tu s námi… i když se neprojevuje… a klidně nechává dojít víno jásotu. Nepodbízí se, nekřičí hlasitě, že právě on může zasáhnout. Sedí tiše a čeká, až mu přineseme "vodu" svého nevýrazného života (bez chuti). A čeká, že mu ji přineseme s vírou, že on proměňuje splín v jásot, nudu v elán – vždyť on je dárce života. On totiž přináší to lepší víno, které jsme dosud nezakusili – vždyť on nabízí vždycky víno lepší, než bylo doposud. On to jinak ani neumí – protože jiné víno ani nemá.

May all of you have a blessed and not-so-ordinary week.


