

#### Dear Parishioners,

May the peace and love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with each of you. This weekend, we congratulate all those who are receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. May the Holy Spirit lead them and guide them as they live their life of faith.

We have had a lot of beautiful weather these past few weeks, but our farmers and those with gardens need some rain. Let us pray for rain and for favorable weather for our farmers and ranchers.

Lent is quickly passing by and Holy Week will be here soon. Some of you may already be making plans for Holy Week and Easter. During Holy Week we will have Stations of the Cross on Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. **Our schedule for the Easter Triduum** is as follows:

> Holy Thursday – 7:00 p.m.; Good Friday – 7:00 p.m.; Holy Saturday – 8:30 p.m. Easter Sunday – 6:30 a.m., 8:30 a.m. & 10:30 a.m.

The Easter Triduum, during Holy Week, is our most sacred and solemn week of the whole year. We should make it a priority to attend the celebrations on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday. Please consider making it a priority in your life and the life of your family, setting aside other non-religious activities that may conflict with these sacred days. Let us be faithful to God.

We will be having **Altar Server practice for each of the above celebrations**. Altar Servers will have practice for Holy Thursday on Palm Sunday, April 14, following the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Altar Server practice for Good Friday will be after the 7:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Thursday, and on Holy Saturday, practice will be at 11:00 a.m. All Altar Servers who are scheduled to serve at each of the above celebrations are asked to be at these practices. If you are not able to serve when scheduled, please find a substitute for yourself and be sure to tell them to be at the practice for that particular day. Also, please contact the parish office so that we will know who will be serving. Thank you to all of you for serving at God's Altar.

In today's gospel, we hear the story of the Prodigal Son. The son squanders his inheritance and then returns, out of desperation, to the father and asks for forgiveness. The father runs out to meet him and gives forgiveness even before it is asked for. Our Heavenly Father runs out to meet us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) to offer us forgiveness. Are we running to Him? Or, is pride keeping us from asking the Father for forgiveness in this special Sacrament. Check this bulletin for the times for confession in all the neighboring parishes and then schedule the time you can run to the Father and ask for forgiveness of your sins. This is a great gift! May we all accept what the Father offers us.

Druhý syn, jakoby spravedlivý, nařkne otce z krutosti, ač všechen majetek má k dispozici. Fakticky poslušnost otci prožívá jako břemeno a svému bratrovi závidí, proto není schopen milosrdenství. Takový postoj vylučuje ze společenství lásky. (Vira.cz)

Please join us with your family for **Stations of the Cross** this Wednesday, at 6:30 pm. By meditating upon the Stations of the Cross, we unite ourselves to the suffering of Jesus and we appreciate more all that He suffered for us. In doing so, we experience, in a deeper way, His resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday.

Every year during Holy Week the Church celebrates the annual Chrism Mass. At this Mass, all of the priests of the diocese are present and renew their priestly promises, and the Holy Oils of the Sick, Catechumens, and Sacred Chrism are blessed by the bishop and distributed to all the parishes of the Diocese. If you have never been to a Chrism Mass, I invite you to attend. It is truly a beautiful celebration. The Chrism Mass will be on Tuesday, April 16, at 10:30 a.m. at St. Vincent DePaul Parish in northwest Austin. If you decide to attend, I recommend arriving early to get a good place to sit.
