# Dear friends in Christ,

He is Risen! He is truly Risen! Today is the Octave Day of the Season of Easter. The Octave Day is the 8<sup>th</sup> day, which represents a new creation and new life. It also refers to the new creation that will take place at the Second Coming of Jesus, which is beyond time. Jesus truly gave us a new creation, a new life and a new meaning to life, with His death and resurrection. May we always think about what that means to us as we live as His disciples each day.

Congratulations to those who entered the Church last Saturday evening through the Sacraments of Initiation. It is my hope and prayer that you experience the love of Jesus each day of your life and that you find a welcome home here at Holy Trinity Parish.

On this Second Sunday of Easter, we hear in today's Gospel about Thomas and how he doubted the resurrection of our Lord. He is offered the mercy of Jesus. Jesus forgives him of his doubt. We also may sometimes doubt the resurrection of the Lord, or even His presence with us in our lives of faith. Maybe we even deny knowing Him, or we walk away from Him because we just do not understand the way He is working in our life or in the lives of those we love. Maybe we are just not able to see His presence in the world. Jesus says, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." It is through faith that we are able to believe. Sometimes we have to pray for the gift of faith. We need to pray each day that we do not lose our faith and that it becomes stronger within us. Also, believing means putting into practice what we have received in faith. May all of us grow in our faith and in our belief by living lives of faithfulness to our Lord.

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. Between 1930 and 1938, Jesus appeared to Sister Faustina, a Sister of Mercy in Poland who initiated the Divine Mercy devotion. She was canonized on April 30, 2000, the Sunday after Easter, the Feast of Divine Mercy. On Good Friday, 1937, Jesus requested that Sr. Faustina make a special novena before the Feast of Mercy, from Good Friday through the following Saturday. Jesus also asked that a picture be painted according to the vision of Himself as the fountain of mercy. He gave her a chaplet to be recited and said that it was appropriate to pray the chaplet at three o'clock each afternoon (the Hour of Great Mercy). May we all be open to receiving the love and mercy of God. A Divine Mercy Holy Hour will take place this Sunday, April 28, at 3:00 p.m. Everyone is invited to attend.

Please pray for all the ladies attending the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women Convention in Waco this week, Sunday thru Tuesday. May our Lord bless all these ladies who do so much for the Church and for Vocations to the Priesthood.

Something to think about: Žádné dveře nejsou pro Krista pevně zavřené. Žádný zámek, ani závora jej nemohou zastavit. On je ten, který rozrazil bronzovou bránu a železnou závoru podsvětí (srv. Ž 107,16), on je ten, který přichází i zavřenými dveřmi. V obou případech vyvádí člověka z vězení smrti, strachu, uzavřenosti. Přichází, aby člověka vysvobodil. A nepřichází s prázdnou: dává dar pokoje. Dar pokoje silnější než strach z okolí, než úzkost o vlastní život. Kristus totiž osvobozuje od starého člověka ovládaného strachem, uzavřeného do sebe, neschopného vyjít ze sebe a nabídnout druhým osvobození, nový život. Jen Kristus může učinit tu proměnu, přivést na svět nové stvoření vdechnutím oživujícího Ducha.

Pokud by učedníci zůstali uzavřeni ve svém malém společenství, nemohli by dávat dál ten úžasný dar nového života. Skanzenové křesťanství, které se uzavírá do svých malých velkých problémů a hledí jen na vlastní pohodlí či prospěch, není k životu: je doslova neplodné, protože neplodí nové křesťany.

Učedníci byli zavřeni jen krátce, někteří z nás jsou možná zavřeni už dlouho: a tak zakrněli, zkostnatěli … Nemá moc velký smysl snažit se rozhýbat ztuhlou kostru: smysluplnější je toužit po Duchu, který svým vanutím tvoří nové kosti, šlachy a svaly (srv. Ez 37,3-6), nové nohy schopné vyjít a kráčet (srv. Ef 6,15), nový jazyk schopný hlásat veliké Boží činy (Sk 2,11).

Kristus může přicházet zavřenými dveřmi, ne však zavřeným srdcem: on stojí u dveří a tluče (Zj 3,20). Je na nás, zda mu otevřeme ony dveře, kterými nechce projít bez našeho souhlasu. A klíčem k otevření je touha: kdo žízní po vodě z Kristova boku, ať přistoupí; kdo touží, ať zadarmo nabere vody života (srv. Zj 22,17). Touha, která vyústí ve volání: Přijď, Pane Ježíši (Zj 22,20).
