

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. A very happy Mother's Day to all of our mothers. I hope and pray that you have a very blessed and joyful day.

Here we are in this beautiful month of May. May is always a month dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Monday, May 13, is the memorial of Our Lady of Fatima. Have you ever read about the apparition of Mary in Fatima, Portugal in 1917? It is quite remarkable, and the final apparition, which included the miracle of the sun, was witnessed by thousands of people and reported in newspapers throughout the world. I would recommend taking the time to read about this apparition and/or watch the movie about it, paying special attention to Mary's message to the three children that she appeared to.

On Monday, May 13, we will have Mass at 12 Noon. During Mass we will also have the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. If you are planning on having surgery any time soon I would recommend that you come to this Mass to be anointed. Or, if you are ill in any way, come for anointing.

Jarrell High School will hold its Baccalaureate Service here on Monday, May 13, at 7:00 pm. Everyone is invited to come and support these Seniors as they prepare for graduation.

Tuesday, May 14, is the feast day of St. Matthew, Apostle. Wednesday, May 15, is the memorial of St. Isidore, the patron saint of farmers. All you farmers should be at Mass to celebrate his feast day and ask for his intercession. I encourage everyone to try to attend Mass on these important feast days. Let us celebrate the lives of the saints and ask for their intercession in our lives of faith.

As I mentioned a few weeks ago, the weather has been much warmer lately. Usually when summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.

Today's Gospel is very short but contains a powerful message. Jesus says, "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me." Jesus is the Shepherd, we are His sheep. Do we listen to the voice of Jesus and follow Him, or, are we listening to too many other voices that tell us to live in a way that is contrary to the way of Jesus? Too many Christians today are following a voice other than the voice of Jesus. They have accepted teachings that are not those of Jesus. But yet they seem to convince themselves that those teachings are ok. Teachings such as abortion, contraception, tubal ligations, vasectomies, divorce, euthanasia, living together before marriage (cohabitation), pornography, illegal drug use, excessive use of alcohol, cursing, gossip, slander, and many other sins. Those who say that these are ok to do are not speaking in the name of Jesus. Let us only listen to the voice of Jesus. As He says in today's Gospel, "I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." Living the way of Jesus as the Church teaches leads us to Heaven. Don't allow other voices to lead you in the opposite direction.

This being the month of Mary, we will have the Crowning of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Wednesday, May 15. It will also be the closing Mass for our Religious Education Year. Come and honor the mother of Jesus, who is also our Mother.

Please pray for the 5 seminarians who will be ordained transitional deacons on Saturday, May 18. May they truly have the spirit of service within them during this diaconate year. My nephew, Kyle Nesrsta, is one of those being ordained to the diaconate. God willing, they will all be ordained priests next year.
