Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! This Monday is Memorial Day. Please pray for the souls of all men and women who have died in the service of our country. May they rest in peace.

Next Sunday is our June Parish Fundraiser. Come and enjoy a wonderful meal and then stay for the music and dancing. Let us come together and celebrate all that God has done for us and for our parish.

Next Sunday, we will celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. Lectors are reminded to check the readings. We will be using the readings from those marked as "May 30 or June 2" on page 95 of the Today's Missal (it is not in your workbooks).

Since Easter, we have been reading a lot from the Acts of the Apostles every week. At the very beginning of the Acts of the Apostles, the Holy Spirit is given to the apostles at Pentecost. Filled with the Spirit, they were sent to witness in Jerusalem and to the ends of the earth. They encountered many problems and difficulties in their mission. At times they were rejected and misunderstood. They faced threats, abuse and violence for the sake of the gospel. This was to be expected. What was not expected was the disagreement and confusion among the followers of Jesus brought about by some of the teachers. They were still human and were not perfect. Today, we heard what Paul and Barnabas chose to do about the problem which arose. They agreed to meet with the apostles and elders in Jerusalem, where they sought the guidance of the Holy Spirit. This meeting became known as the Council of Jerusalem, the first Council of the Church. They agreed that no undue burden was to be placed on the people, and the requirement of circumcision was lifted.

Since this meeting, the Church has held many Councils to settle questions of faith and questions regarding Church organization and Church law. The Holy Spirit has been active in each Council and is very much alive and active in the Church today. We are challenged to imitate the apostles and the leaders of the Church through the centuries in their efforts to build bridges and to be one of mind and heart in all things. We must ask ourselves what division exists in our lives so that we can ask the Holy Spirit to help us resolve them. What problems do we face in the Church that require a greater power to bring them to resolution?

The mission of the Church continues today just as it began in that first community of believers. Much has changed since then, but the love of God is still our cry to which the Holy Spirit gives voice for all to hear. This love, present in the Holy Spirit, is the fruit of God's grace which will help us to overcome division and be of one heart, one mind and one body in Christ, the risen Lord. Let us truly allow Him to work within us, and through us, to bring unity and peace among us.

Duch je oním spojem, komunikátorem, prostředníkem ve vztahu, kterým se smíme propojit s Bohem. Slovo "Přímluvce" znamená, že Duch svatý je v tomto propojení aktivním aktérem, nikoli jen technickým prostředkem! Celá církev se po staletí učí naslouchat, co nám Duch říká a kam nás vede.

Mayo 25-26, Sexto Domingo de Pascua: En el Evangelio de este Domingo, Jesús promete enviarnos un intermediario para ayudar a los discípulos a llevar a cabo la misión de Jesús.
