**To serve as a Mass Minister, Catechist or CCE Volunteer, on a parish council, etc, you must be certified in the diocesan Ethics & Integrity in Ministry (EIM) course, but please don't let this stop you from volunteering, as it is an easy process that only takes 2 hours of your time every three years. For more information about becoming/remaining EIM certified, please read the following:

Mark your calendars and prepare for our upcoming Ethics & Integrity in Ministry (EIM) Workshop on Saturday, July 20, from 9:00 – 11:00 a.m. in the PAC Bldg. Several of our parishioners/ministers/catechists are in need of a refresher course this July – so please check your renewal date. If you don't remember your renewal date, you can find it on the diocesan website ... and if help is needed, please contact the parish office. If you're not able to attend this one, there are always workshops being held in many locations in the diocese each month (though we are one of the only one in July, so please make every effort to attend if your last workshop was in July of 2016). All other workshop dates/locations can be found on the diocesan website at www.austindiocese.org. **If you plan to attend this – or any other workshop – you need to do some things prior to the class!** You will register for the workshop on the diocesan website. If you don't have access to the internet, you may contact the parish office and we will help you out. But, for those of you who do, please go online (www.austindiocese.org) and follow all of the directions on the Ethics & Integrity in Ministry page. If you have already taken an EIM course, then you will just have to sign up for a workshop. If you have NEVER taken an EIM course, then you will have to complete the online application and sign up for the workshop at the same time. **It is very important that you do all of the above before attending the workshop!** This workshop is now posted on the diocesan website, so please sign-up as soon as possible. **As new diocesan policy, workshop registration will close 24 hours before the class – so you must register by July 18 ... and walk-ins CANNOT be admitted on the day of the workshop!** Questions or problems...don't hesitate to call us!

The App also has the daily readings, lives of the saints and other useful information. Dress appropriately for Mass wherever you may go. Read the daily scripture readings with your family. Use it as a time to strengthen your family relationships as well as your relationship with our Lord. And, do not forget to pray.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that the Kingdom of God is more important than anything else in our life. He says that those who do not put God and His Kingdom as the main priority in their life are not "fit for the kingdom of God." Is living your faith and passing it on to your children and grandchildren the most important thing in your life? Many people have a desire for living a good and holy life, but they keep allowing themselves to be drawn back to a lifestyle that is unhealthy and not fit for a person who lives in God's Kingdom. Jesus says we have to stop looking back to what was and, instead, look forward to what is to come. He says in Luke's Gospel, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."
