Workshop registration will close 24 hours before the class – so you must call to be registered by July 17 ... and walk-ins CANNOT be admitted on the day of the workshop!! Dear friends in Christ,

May the grace and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. I hope all of you had a very enjoyable Fourth of July. In today's Gospel, Jesus is telling the seventy-two to trust in God for all their needs and to not worry about being rejected. Jesus tells them to not carry extra sandals or purses or other provisions. However, this is not a command for us to go through life without insurance, plans, savings or friends. It is a simple reminder that our ultimate trust must be in God and His desire to provide for us. Jesus is not telling us to be lazy, but neither is He telling us to be self-sufficient. Many of us go through life too weighed down by our own efforts to provide for our security as if there were no gracious and giving God.

Jesus urged His disciples to seek contentment, not promotion. Happiness in life is not having what you want, but wanting what you have. How many marriages or careers would be saved if we could learn this? Be content with what you have instead of continually seeking something else in life. Don't be like the cow that is always looking at and wanting the green grass on the other side of the fence, never realizing that the grass on its own side is actually greener than that on the other side. Many times we do the same and, when we get to the other side, we realize we are not any happier, any more satisfied, or any more fulfilled than we were before.

Jesus knew that not every announcement of the good news would be well-received. He knew that sometimes the disciples would encounter the same kind of rejection he faced. Jesus tells His disciples to brush the dust of the towns off their feet when they are rejected. He is telling them to brush off the defeat and rejection of one house before they move on to the next. Too often, we drag the accumulated residue of our rejections and defeats like over-stuffed suitcases. Jesus is telling us to lighten up and drop off the excess baggage of old failures. Do not carry those old wounds around with you. Continue doing what is right even though it is not accepted by some. Put your faith in God, not in other people. Do not be afraid to proclaim your Catholic Christian life to others by the example you give in the way you live your life and by what you say.

We must announce the same Word of God to all people, to those who accept us and to those who reject us. Accepted or rejected, it is still the Good News of Jesus. Focus upon this Good News, and not upon being rejected, and you will live a happier and more joyful life.

Především: nejde o realizaci lidských přání a projektů, ani o budování fungujícího církevního systému, ani o to, zda bude celé území pokryto farami a farnostmi. V tomto evangeliu jde výrazně o to, že v Ježíši přichází Boží království, že on Boží dar osobně přináší a že potřebuje dělníky na to, aby mu připravili cestu, popřípadě spolupracovali s ním na žni. Všechna naše církevní konání (mše, poutě, kázání, zpovídání, atd.) mají svůj základní a nezbytný smysl tehdy a jen tehdy, když v nás připravují cestu Ježíši a jsou spoluúčastna na žni. Negativně: každá církevní i osobní činnost, která zatemňuje, stírá rozdíl mezi dobrem a zlem, která není jasně proti zlu nebo která si libuje sama v sobě a není připravováním cesty Kristu, má sotva své oprávnění, není "dělnickou činností" ve smyslu tohoto evangelia, i kdyby na ní ten člověk padal vysílením. Old Business:

- 1. Parish Mission The dates for the 2019 Parish Mission are October 20-24.
- 2. Encountering Christ Capital Campaign There is \$27,539.40 in the parish account to be used for the identified projects.
- 3. Long-Range Plan They continue to gather information for this plan, and will meet with the LRP committee in July.
- **4. Drive on North Side of Church –** The project is pending completion of the long-range plan.
