Catholic Social Teaching Corner - July 27/28: In today's Gospel, the disciples ask Jesus to teach them to pray and He gives them what we call "the Lord's prayer". The Hebrew word that begins the prayer is "Abba", which translates to "papa" or "daddy". In other words, Jesus invites us, as disciples, to pray intimately with God. This intimacy with God implies intimacy with one another. If God is our father, then we have many brothers and sisters. In our prayer, do we remember to pray for their needs as well as our own? Is our prayer stretching us to embrace the needs of the poor, the needy and vulnerable throughout our world?

Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace and love of our Lord be with each of you. What a blessing the beautiful 'cooler' weather has been for us!

In today's first reading, we hear about how Abraham's three guests continue on their journey to Sodom and Gomorrah. Abraham's nephew, whom Abraham also calls "his brother", Lot, and his family, lived in Sodom. It was a place of immorality and disrespect. Many kinds of immoral behavior were practiced there as well as total disrespect for the human person. People were very selfish and self-serving. The three angels who had visited Abraham were being sent to Sodom to destroy it. Abraham pleads with them not to destroy the city if they can find at least 10 good people there. The angels say they will not destroy Sodom if they can find 10 good people there. The reading of today ends at this point. However, if you read further in Genesis, you get the rest of the story. Apparently, Lot's family was rather small. The angels visit Lot and stay in his home. While staying there, men from the city come and want their way with these angels, not knowing who they were. The angels make a bright light which blinds the men so that Lot and his family remain safe. The angels tell Lot to leave the city for it will be destroyed. God is merciful to Lot's family, but judgment comes upon everyone else.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that God is a good Father. He will only give us what is good for us. He will protect us on the day of judgement, just as He protected Lot and his family. As Jesus says, we need to ask, seek and knock, and God will give according to what is best for us. Sometimes, as we know, the answer is "no" because that is what is best for us at that particular moment. If we accept what He gives, then He is with us and helps us through all situations in life. May we respond in faith as Abraham and Lot responded to our Lord. Let us truly live the faith we profess knowing that the love of the Father is with us at all times

K úvaze: Staráš se o mnoho věcí... jen jedno je třeba. Kdyby Ježíš viděl naše „složitě modlitby“, nevyslovil by tuto výtku? Složitě pobožnosti, překombinované způsoby modlitby. Někdy kumulace mnoha modliteb... je toto zbožnost, která se líbí Bohu? A která nás k Otci přibližuje? Anebo je to jen projev našeho (dosud) „nekřesťanského“ uvažování, že modlitba záleží v množství slov či v nějakých formulích? Že je třeba se „odmodlit“ to či ono?

Jak málo je přitom třeba... stačí se postavit před Boží tvář (ano, uvědomit si, že teď nejsem sám, Otec je blízko, v mém srdci!) a volat „Otče“, „tátinku“. Mám problémy přijmout Otce, protože můj otec byl zlý? Pak potřebuji „se poprat“ s větou, že Otec dává skvostné věci těm, kdo ho prosí – jeho ucho slyší, jeho ruka je otevřená.

A když přijmu Ježíšova slova, pak mohu zakusit radost dítěte, které má tátu, dobrého tátu. Radost z toho, že s tátou mohu být, mluvit. A protože tento „táta“ je prostě nejlepší, tak samozřejmě toužím, aby byl poznán i od druhých lidí. Žádám, aby přišel on sám, s celou mocí, oděný slávou. S jistotou mohu prosit tátu o vše, co potřebuji – a vím, že on neodmítne. A pokud mi nedá to, co chci, tak určitě dá něco lepšího, protože on je prostě nepřekonatelný táta. A ze všeho „nejvíc“ chce dát svého Ducha – Dar, který má v sobě všechny dary. Dar, který je přímo božský.

Milované dítě nepotřebuje složité formulace, aby prosilo o něco svého tátu. Stačí mu jediné – být s tátou a volat „táto“. A táta ví... (Pastorace.cz)
