Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches about the locked door and entrance into the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus says that not all who know Him will be allowed to enter. Why? Because, instead of listening to Him and following Him, they did their own thing in life. They did not keep the commandments. Last week, we heard how we need to be a faithful witness of Jesus Christ and His Church. We heard of how we need to stand up for the truth and how we should be vigilant and watchful, prepared and waiting for the Second Coming of Jesus. In today's readings, these themes of remaining vigilant and watchful, of being prepared, continue.

In today's gospel, we are told that if we are too overweight with sin and the baggage of this world, we will not fit through the "narrow gate". If we have not lived disciplined lives and have not properly prepared ourselves, as a football player prepares for the upcoming football season, then we will be cut from the team, and left outside and there will not be time enough for us to get into shape, to cleanse and purify our bodies. There will not be time enough to steam away and work off that weight of sin and there will not be time enough to drop the excess baggage of this world before the door closes and it is locked in front of us. Then we will cry out, "Sir, open for us." and Jesus will say in reply, "I do not know where you come from." We must prepare ourselves and prove ourselves to be true followers of Jesus Christ.

Jesus tells us in the gospel of Matthew, 7:21, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven." Jesus also says in that same chapter that many will prophecy in His name but Jesus will tell them "I never knew you". This is because they did not do the will of God the Father. These were false prophets who prophesied not the truth of Christ, but only their own words and not the Words of Jesus. For us to be true witnesses and disciples of Jesus, we must lead discipline lives. By doing this, we will one day enter the Kingdom of God. May all of us strive to enter through the "narrow gate. When we leave this world and approach the kingdom of heaven and say, "Sir, open for us", let us not be told by Jesus, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me you evildoers." ...but, instead, may the words of Jesus be, "With you I am well pleased. Come enter into my Kingdom."

In today's second reading, of the letter to the Hebrews, St. Paul tells us that we must be disciplined, just as a parent disciplines their child, as well as lead a disciplined life. St. Paul tells us to "endure your trials as discipline; God treats you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline?" If Jesus accepted the discipline of the Father, should we, who are less holy than Jesus, accept the same discipline as well? Besides, St. Paul tells us that this discipline will have a joyful outcome. He says, "At the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it." The school of discipline is not an easy school nor is it always a pleasant one. But when we endure it and accept it as a special grace from God, then we see the great benefits and blessings we receive from having gone through it. We become a better people, we become more loving, compassionate, and patient with others and most importantly we become more faithful to Christ and His Church. A disciplined life helps us to defend ourselves against and fight off all that is evil and it also helps us to persevere when all seems to overwhelm us.

Any time we do not remain focused on Jesus, we open the door for the devil to enter our lives. That is why leading a disciplined life is so important. It keeps us fit as a fiddle, physically and spiritually, to enter through the narrow door right into the Kingdom of God. And what a great and wonderful joy that will be.

K úvaze: I když dnes snad nikdo nežije život příliš snadný a mnozí jsou uhonění, unavení, žijeme přes to ve světě, který v zásadě propaguje širokou cestu, pohodlný vstup, neomezenou nezodpovědnost jako ideál, v němž by bylo člověku dobře. Co je lehčí, je samo sebou předkládáno jako lepší. Protože Boží plán spásy bere člověka vážně, musí i ten, kdo chce mít na spáse podíl, vzít vážně sebe, svůj život a jeho požadavky. To neznamená udělat se středem světa, ani to není výzva k lehkomyslnosti. Ale znamená to dostát "rozměrům" člověka i životem jejich důstojnosti a možnostem, i když je to těžké.

Další starostí dnešního člověka by mělo být, aby si uvědomoval, kam svým životem jde a vstupuje, kam vedou dveře, do nichž se tlačí - zda vedou skutečně do království.

Shrňme: člověk by měl tuto perikopu promyslet ne jako slova strašení, ale jako slova, vedoucí ke skutečné životní moudrosti.
