Dear friends in Christ,

This weekend, we celebrate the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Sunday, September 8. You may want to bake a birthday cake at home and celebrate with your family. This would be a good day to pray the rosary together as a family also. Happy Birthday Mary!

Our Parish Bazaar is one week away. If you have not volunteered to work, please do so by signing up on the list at the entrance of the church for the area in which you would like to work. Everyone is needed to help lighten the load so that all will be a success.

Beware of Worldly ways! This should be our cry in our day and time. This is what we hear in today's readings. Beware of Worldly ways. Our first reading was taken from the Book of Wisdom. We read from this book several times during the year and usually at funerals. It is a very beautifully written book and it does contain much Wisdom. This book was written for Jews living in Egypt, probably in Alexandria. Alexandria was a great center of learning and was highly influenced by Greek culture and philosophy. The problem for the Jews living in Alexandria was that Greek philosophy, along with the influence of science, was very secular. God simply had no role in what might be called "Greek wisdom." It stressed the intellect of the human and how that intellect and its improvement was the most important part of our existence. This was creating a crisis of faith. The faith of the Jews was being replaced by secular philosophies and ideals. The writer of the book of Wisdom sought to confront popular culture and to convince his Jewish readers to avoid secular wisdom. Real wisdom sees that we do not live for ourselves; we live for God. The writer wanted to give believers support when society was not geared to support believers in God.

Our world today suffers from many of the same problems. We are immersed in a culture that is highly secular, that holds Christianity in disdain and believes that we exist only for ourselves -- the deadly part of secular humanism. Today, Christians are a minority, struggling to hold on to virtues no longer held by most of society. We, too, need strengthening in our resolve to follow God. Wisdom reminds us of our ultimate dependence on God. All things are from Him, and all people and things are called to serve Him. However, many Christians today believe the opposite -- they believe that God exists to serve us. Wisdom warns us not to fall into this trap.

In today's Gospel, Jesus calls all of us to be His disciples. We are reminded that if we choose to be His disciple then there are demands. Jesus is telling us that if we are to follow Him, to be true disciples, then our father, our mother, our wife, our husband, our children - everyone and everything - are to take second-place to our love for God.

We are reminded that this attitude we are called to have is a choice and that it is difficult. This is precisely what it means to pick up the cross. We are to make a choice to die to everything except our love for God. This is not easy, for it means that many times we will oppose popular attitudes.

We are urged by Wisdom to pay close attention to what society would have us do, then pay closer attention to the Scriptures and what God would have us do. Our Church works hard to teach the way of the Gospel. But it is ridiculed for many of its stands, and sometimes we are the first to dismiss our Church and the Gospel. However, today we are counseled to be wary of the way of the world. Which way will we follow, the way of the world or the way of Jesus?

K úvaze: Základní otázka: Komu jsou tato slova určená? Být učedníkem a následovat Ježíše znamená na některých místech Nového zákona patřit mezi dvanáct, jinde patřit mezi širší okruh, ale třeba pro Jana je následování totéž, co uvěřit.

Podíváme-li se na Ježíšovo okolí v evangeliích, potom tam opravdu najdeme pestrou společnost - od okukujících přes chvilkové nadšence a váhavce až po ty, kteří "opustili všechno a šli za ním". V pronásledování vydrželi ovšem jen ti poslední. Zdá se, že podobná situace je i u nás dnes: okolo Ježíše byla a je pestrá společnost: přihlížející, fandové, příznivci, "diplomaté", bázlivci, učedníci. Jen ti poslední se zřejmě chtějí od něho něčemu důležitému naučit a naučí se. A právě o to "naučení se životu" jde zřejmě víc, než o co jiného. Tedy slova dnešního evangelia platí v plném smyslu především pro ty, kdo mají učit jiné (biskupové, kněží ... ale také rodiče) a dále pro každého, kdo to myslí s křesťanstvím vážně, což neznamená, že je ochoten uvěřit těm nejneuvěřitelnějším věcem, ale znamená to, že poznal v Ježíši Mistra a Pána svého života a proto se chce od něho učit. Tvrdost dnešní doby má tu výhodu, že donutí nakonec každého, aby "přiznal barvu" a pokud chce být učedníkem čili pořádným křesťanem, bude velmi brzo postaven před volbu, co je ochoten ztratit a milovat méně. Pokud Krista, tak dříve nebo později ztratí své křesťanství tak jako tak. Kdo se totiž nerozloučí dříve nebo později se vším, co má (byť by to byla ta poslední a nejbližší věc, totiž mé vlastní já), ten se rozloučí dříve nebo později s Kristem. Podobenství o stavbě věže a vedení války jen podtrhují, že nelze brát tyto ostré požadavky evangelia nedůsledně. (Pastorace.cz)
