Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. Our Religious Education Program began two weeks ago. I thank all of our parents for bringing their children to learn about the Bible, Jesus Christ, and His Church. Parents are always invited and encouraged to attend the Mass at 6:30 p.m. Your presence at Mass is a great sign of support to your children. Please come and join us as we celebrate this awesome gift that our Lord has given to us.

This week we celebrate many important feast days. Monday: St. Jerome; Tuesday: St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus; Wednesday: The Holy Guardian Angels; Friday: St. Francis of Assisi; Saturday: Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos. We will not have Mass on Monday, but try to attend weekday Mass on some of these important saint days.

You may not have heard much about Blessed Francis Seelos. Here is a little information taken from the Religious Order of the Redemptorists: Francis Xavier Seelos was born in Fussen, Bavaria, on January 11, 1819. He studied philosophy at the University of Munich and began theology as a diocesan seminarian. After visiting the Redemptorists in Altötting, where he heard of their missionary work in North America, he decided to join them.

With their approval, he set off for the United States in 1843 where he made his novitiate. He made his profession in Baltimore in May 1844 and was ordained a priest there in December. His first assignment was to St. Philomena's in Pittsburgh where he served for six years as assistant under the leadership of John Neumann, who was pastor and superior of the community. Father Seelos went on to serve as superior of the community and novice master for three more years.

He was appointed pastor of St. Alphonsus in Baltimore, 1854; pastor and prefect of students at Sts. Peter and Paul in Cumberland, MD, 1857; and pastor and prefect of students at St. Mary's in Annapolis, Md., 1862.

Replaced as prefect of students, he preached missions in German and English throughout the Northeast and Midwest. Father Seelos was always an active and highly successful missioner. He was particularly devoted to the confessional, and was revered as an exceptional confessor and spiritual director. After a year as assistant pastor of St. Mary's in Detroit in 1866, he was assigned as pastor of Assumption Parish in New Orleans. There he made a great effort to care for the poor, sick, and neglected. While caring for victims of yellow fever, he contracted the disease himself. Only a year after being assigned, he died in New Orleans on October 4, 1867. He was beatified in 2000.

Fr. Seelos' bones are kept in a reliquary at the St. Francis Seelos Shrine in New Orleans. If you are ever in New Orleans or just passing through, I encourage you to stop by and visit this shrine.

If we are to be winners in life and be successful in our endeavors we, too, need a game plan in life. In today's second reading, from the letter of Paul to Timothy, Paul gives us "a game plan" for eternal life. He extols Timothy to ignore the habits of those around him and to have total dedication to Christ. He says: "...pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Compete well for the faith..." And who is our coach in this all-important game? Our coach is the Holy Spirit! With this help, we can be attentive to the teachings of Moses, the prophets, and, most importantly, to Jesus. God has given us the best game plan available which is found in the Sacred Scriptures and the Catholic Church. The Holy Spirit uses these to guide us so that we win in this game of life and death. With all this help we can overcome our complacency. With the help of the Spirit, we can give priority to the gospel message instead of the misleading messages we often receive from the world. By being open to the gifts of the Holy Spirit we can obtain the fruits of the Spirit which echo in Paul's words to Timothy. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we, too, can take firm hold of eternal life.

In today's Gospel reading we see what happens to a person who is not allowing the Holy Spirit to be their coach in life. Instead of following the "game plan" of the Spirit of God, the rich man followed his own "game plan", a plan in which he was only focused on himself and his needs. Because he only thought of himself the rich man never saw the beggar, Lazarus, at his gate. Therefore, he never did anything to help Lazarus. Lazarus, having suffered much, died and went to heaven. The rich man went to hell. When we live only for ourselves, being selfish and self-centered, we are not following the Holy Spirit's "game plan". We begin to die spiritually. But if we follow the "game plan" of the Holy Spirit, which is revealed to us through Scripture and the Church, we grow to become like Jesus and are invited to share in His eternal kingdom, His eternal "game plan". Which "game plan" are you following in your life? Let us pray that we are following God's "game plan" and that our ears and our heart will be open to listen to our coach, the Holy Spirit.

K úvaze: Ten boháč je pro nás velkým mementem: neuzavřít se do vězení svého domu, do vězení svých plánů. Nenechat se uspat stereotypem zajištěného a fungujícího života, zaběhlého systému: Bůh má daleko lepší plány s naším životem. Jsou to plány, které překračují naše plány tak, jako nebesa převyšují zemi. Nemusíme se stát mystiky, abychom mohli poznat tyto Boží a vskutku božské plány. Stačí otevřít jeho slovo, slovo Písma. Otevřít Bibli: tak banální věc, která může změnit náš často banální život ve velkolepé dobrodružství.

Boží slovo není nebezpečné, vždyť nechce zničit náš život - a pokud něco zničí, tak jen slepé cesty, které odvádějí od života. Nemusíme se bát pohledu Božího, ale spíš svého. Největším nepřítelem tvého života není Bůh, ale ty sám: nemusíš se bát Boha, ale sebe sama, svých "lidských, příliš lidských plánů".
