Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."*

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. This week we will celebrate the feast of day of St. Teresa of Jesus, also known as St. Teresa of Avila, on Tuesday, October 15. She was truly a remarkable woman of the 16th century. Thursday, October 17, is the feast of St. Ignatius of Antioch. He was bishop of Antioch in what is today Syria. It was a very strong Christian community. St. Ignatius wrote many letters and he is the person who began calling the Church Catholic. The name stuck and has been used ever since. He was put to death in the year 107 AD and thus became a martyr. Friday, October 18 is the feast of St. Luke, one of the writers of the four Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles. He died in the 1st Century. On Saturday morning, October 19, we celebrate the feast of St. John de Brébeuf, St. Isaac Jogues and companions. They were missionaries to the area of North America around Albany, New York and southern Canada. They became martyrs of the Church as they were killed by the Iroquois and Huron Indians between the years of 1642 and 1649. Please try to attend Mass on some of these feast days.

Don't forget that this is Respect Life month. Continue to pray for those who are praying in front of abortion clinics, for those who are going there for abortions, and for those who are working for Planned Parenthood and other abortion facilities killing babies in the wombs of their mothers. May they have a conversion of heart and mind and may God's mercy be with them. May they see the evil in what they are doing. Please come to Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the church on Thursday afternoon/evening and pray for a respect for life.

October is also the month of the rosary. Be sure to pray the rosary daily with your family. May the love and protection of our Blessed Mother Mary be with you all.

Today's readings speak to us about healing and faith. In the first reading from the Old Testament Book of Kings, Naaman is healed of his leprosy with the help of Elisha. In the gospel, ten lepers are healed. The one who was the foreigner, the Samaritan, is the only one that returned to the Lord to give him thanks for the healing. Naaman was also a foreigner who was healed. Both of these stories point out the fact that God loves all people, not just a select few. Sometimes it is those who do not know Him who are more thankful than those who do claim to know Him. Sometimes they seem to have more faith than religious leaders do. How about us? Are we like the nine lepers who never returned to give thanks to Jesus? Or are we like Naaman and the Samaritan who rejoiced over their being healed and who gave thanks to God? Are we grateful to our parents, teachers, priests, nuns, and all others who try to help us walk with God? Ingratitude leads to bitterness, hatred, anger, revenge, negativity, and much more. Let us pray that we have a heart filled with gratitude and an awareness of what God does for us each day. His mercy and love endures forever. "Sing joyfully to the Lord, all you lands: break into song; sing praise." Ps 34:4.

K úvaze: Evangelní perikopa je velmi zajímavá: všech deset začalo dobře, všech deset projevilo víru v Krista, přijalo uzdravení, ale... jen jeden „došel „chvály“ od Krista, jen jeden přijal spásu. Nemáme před sebou postoj nevíry či zatvzelenosti vůči Kristu: tyto nemocní se projevili jako zbožní a věřící, proto volali „smiluj se nad námi, Mistře“. Tato víra mohla stačit k přijetí uzdravení, ale ne k přijetí plnosti Kristova daru. Všichni projevili důvěru v Krista, ale jen jeden dospěl ke skutečné a hluboké víře. Tito malomocní uvěřili v Krista jako divotvůrce, ale jen jeden překročil tuto povrchní víru a objevil víru hlubší, víru navazující osobní vztah ke Kristu. V tomto evangeliu máme tedy před sebou dva rozdílné přístupy k Bohu: jeden neosobní, druhý osobní. Těch devět se spokojilo s uzdravením, desátý šel dál: ke Kristu. U všech deseti malomocných byly oči upřeny k uzdravení: u většiny zůstaly oči hledět na uzdravení, u Samaritána se obrátily ke Kristu. Prvních devět přijalo uzdravení jako „samozřejmost“, jen desátý dokázal žasnout nad „nesamozřejmostí“ daru a chválit Boha za jeho mocný čin. U toho Samaritána bylo uzdravení jen odrazovým můstkem k přijetí většího daru: k přijetí Krista. Jeden přijal plnost, ostatní jen část. Všech deset zpočátku zůstávalo daleko od Krista: devět zůstalo „daleko“, jeden přišel blízko. Devět zůstalo malo-mocných i po uzdravení, ne-schopných přiblížit se ke Kristu (i když už mohli, čili měli moc či schopnost jít k němu blízko), devátý se chopil této nové šance a překonal odstup vůči Mistru.

Tyto dva rozdílné postoje jsou příznačné i pro nás věřící: navenek se všichni projevujeme jako zbožní, všichni se modlíme. Ale jen někteří mají odvahu „jít ke Kristu“, vyznávat ho, děkovat mu, navázat s ním osobní vztah. Mnozí se spokojují jen s prosbou o vyřešení palčivých problémů. Ne že bychom neměli prosit, naopak. Ale často tyto prosby končí... tou samotnou prosbou, ne děkováním ani prohloubením víry. Až příliš často je Kristus jen nástrojem k vyřešení našich problémů, jakýsi divotvůrce, jak tomu bylo i u těch malomocných. Přístupujeme k němu jako k automatu: vhodíme minci (modlitbu) a očekáváme zvolené zboží (vyslyšení prosby). A pak můžeme spokojeně odejít a přijít k automatu znovu, až budeme potřebovat. Takový uživatelský postoj se může vkrádat nejen do naší modlitby, ale i do našeho přístupu ke svátostem: svátosti se mohou stát příležitostí k ukojení naší „zbožnosti“, k očištění od špatného svědomí, k „vyprošení si potřebných milostí“. Ale Kristus je víc než pouhý automat na vyřešení našich problémů: je to živá osoba. A jako živá osoba nabízí víc než pouhé uzdravení či vyřešení toho či onoho průšvihů. A od nás očekává, že k němu nebudeme přistupovat jako k automatu, ale jako k živé osobě. Očekává, že jeho dary nás přivedou k vděčnosti, ke chvále, k prohloubení našeho vztahu s ním. Necháme ho čekat ještě dlouho? (Pastorace.cz)
