Dear friends in Christ,

Today is the 4th Sunday of Advent. Christmas is just around the corner. We will be decorating the church this weekend as we prepare for the Christmas Season. Christmas begins the evening of December 24 and continues until Sunday, January 12. Keep your Christmas lights shining brightly all throughout the Christmas Season. Let us celebrate this season in its fullness. During the Christmas Season, we have several important Feast Days. During the Octave of Christmas, we have The Nativity of the Lord on December 25, St. Stephen on December 26, St. John on December 27, The Holy Innocents on December 28, The Holy Family on December 29, St. Sylvester on December 31, and Mary, the Holy Mother of God on January 1. In the remainder of the Christmas Season, we have The Epiphany of the Lord on January 5 and The Baptism of the Lord on January 12. Some of these days, we will not being having a Mass here at Holy Trinity, but try to attend as many of these scheduled Masses as possible. The Lord has given us so much and so many ways in which we can truly experience His love and presence in our life and in the life of our family. Let us accept all He gives us and be united with Him and with one another.

Our Gospel reading today answers the question, "Who needs Joseph?" Mary needed Joseph. Jesus needed Joseph. God needed Joseph. His role was not the usual role of a father and husband. But Joseph played a crucial role in the Christmas event and in the following days, months and years as well.

Joseph, we can say, is a model of obedient faith. The Bible says that he was a righteous man. He knew Scripture. When he heard Mary was pregnant, he knew what the punishment would be. He knew he had the right to divorce her according to Jewish Law and Scripture. He decided to handle the matter with gracious privacy. As he considered his response, an angel appears in a dream to him. He must have been confused by the message of the angel. Mary conceived by the Holy Spirit? Take her as my wife? The child to be born will be a Savior? It was a lot to hear in one dream.

But the amazing thing is that Joseph woke up the next morning and actually did what the angel commanded him to do! Most of us probably would have rubbed our eyes in the morning and would not have given the dream anymore thought and returned to our world of logical thinking. If Joseph would have followed his plan to divorce Mary, he would have retained his standing in the community as an honorable man. He would have been surrounded by support for his obedience to the Scriptures. He would have been supported as the innocent victim, of what seemed to be Mary's unfaithfulness. However, the angel was calling Joseph to an extraordinary faith. God needed a man whose faith and obedience would be stronger than his bruised ego, stronger than his need to be right and stronger than his need to be respected by the community. Joseph was a man whose faith was stronger than and went beyond his trust in what seemed logical. Such a man was hard to find, but God found such a man in Joseph.

Joseph is also a model of courage. Who knows what people said about him since he took Mary into his home. Some would have probably called him a fool. The Bible does not say how Joseph responded, but his response must have been in silence, just as Jesus response was when He was ridiculed as he hung upon the cross. It is difficult enough to suffer criticism. It is even more difficult to suffer unjust criticism. But it is most difficult of all to suffer unjust criticism in silence. Joseph received the courage to face the angry crowd from the quiet place of his heart where he listened to God.

Joseph is also a model of fatherhood, fatherhood for his family. He was a provider. He worked as a carpenter and taught Jesus about the trade. Joseph was a protector, taking his family to Egypt to avoid slaughter by Herod. And probably most important of all, Joseph was present to Jesus. He did not run from his family. It is in the person of Joseph that Jesus learned the true love of a father. I am sure Jesus called Joseph "Abba", daddy, just like he called his heavenly Father Abba. It must have been Joseph's finest hour when he heard these words from Jesus. Who needed Joseph? Mary and Jesus needed Joseph. And so do you and I, especially you who are fathers.

Included is this bulletin is my annual Christmas message to all of you. Please read it and reflect upon as you make final preparations for your Christmas celebrations.

K úvaze: My jsme tak zvyklí na evangelní texty o Ježíšově početí, že si trochu představujeme, že Josef a Maria přijali Boží nabídku jako samozřejmost. Neuvědomujeme si, že Josef a Maria to neměli tak snadné. Vždyť Maria měla své otázky (jak se to stane?), Josef chtěl dokonce propustit svou ženu … Bůh musel oslovit mimořádným způsobem skrze anděla, aby přivedl jak Marii, tak Josefa k přijetí "tohoto bláznivého plánu". Bláznivého, protože nikdy předtím se nestalo, aby žena otěhotněla tak výjimečným způsobem. A nestalo se to ani potom. Byl to případ bez precedentu, jediný v historii. A není divu, že Maria i Josef měli "své lidské výhrady". O to obdivuhodnější je jejich otevřenost vůči Bohu: přijali Boží slovo skrze anděla, i když to bylo bláznivé. A přijali nejen vnitřně, ale i vnějším jednáním: Josef pak skutečně přijal Marii jako manželku, jakoby "se nic nestalo divného". Prostě "skousl" všechna svá "ale" a ve víře přijal Boží plán s jeho životem. Josef se skutečně prokázal jako spravedlivý, jako člověk poslušný Božího slova, tentokrát zjeveného ne Mojžíšovým zákonem, ale andělem. Tak se ukázalo, že jeho poslušnost zřejmě ani předtím nebyla "zkostnatělá" a zákonická, ale živá, projevená Bohu, a ne tolik liteře zákona. (Pastorace.cz)
