Long-Range Plan for Holy Trinity Parish: At our June 14, 2018, Pastoral Council Meeting, the idea that we needed a Long-Range Plan for our parish was discussed. With all the new homes being built in our area, we know that our parish is going to grow. A Long-Range Plan Committee was formed, and, in August of 2018, we sought guidance from the Diocese of Austin. They recommended a few architect firms for us to contact to help us with the planning. RBDR Architects from Waco was chosen by the Committee and the Pastoral Council. For the past 10 months, they have been gathering information from parishioners, statistics for future growth in Williamson County, Jarrell ISD, Georgetown ISD, Jarrell, Texas, and also from our weekend Mass attendance count. After many meetings and discussion, a Long-Range Plan is now in existence for our Parish. This plan will be presented to the parish on Monday, January 27, at 6:30 p.m. in the PAC Bldg. All parishioners are invited and encouraged to attend. May we move forward, in unity, continuing to meet the needs of our parish and continuing to build the kingdom of God in Corn Hill and the surrounding area.

### Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace and love of our Lord Jesus be with each of you. I hope everyone is well rested from all of the Christmas and New Year celebrations. This weekend, the Season of Christmas comes to an end as we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Our Christmas lights and decorations will be taken down and stored away for another year. Tomorrow, the Season of Ordinary Time begins, and will continue until the beginning of Lent on February 26. During Ordinary Time, we reflect on the daily life and ministry of Jesus Christ. Though, as we all know, His life and ministry was not so ordinary. Therefore, our life and ministry should not be so ordinary either. As Christians, we are called to be different. Everything we say and do should reflect our Christian faith, whether it be in the area of family life, business, recreation and relaxation, finances, sexuality, or the way we relate to one another day-to-day.

As we celebrate this Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord and begin Ordinary Time, let us take time to reflect upon how our lives give witness to what we say we believe. Gregory of Nazianzus, a fourth century Church father, tells us: "Let us be buried with Christ by Baptism to rise with him; let us go down with him to be raised with him; and let us rise with him to be glorified with him." In other words, let us live our lives complete in Christ so that we can be Christ to one another.

Jesus' baptism really has several important meanings. First, Jesus is giving His approval to John and to what John is preaching and doing. Secondly, this is another epiphany moment when the voice from the heavens says, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." These words give Jesus His identity as to who He really is. This is truly a manifestation of the presence of God to those who are there. Thirdly, Jesus shows His solidarity with the people who are coming to John to publicly show that they want a new beginning in their life. Fourthly, Jesus' public ministry will begin after this event. His popularity will increase with each passing day.

We celebrate the Feast Day of Jesus' baptism at the beginning of the New Year because it signifies a new beginning in our life just as the new year signifies the beginning of a new time in history. Also, this event of Jesus' baptism is an epiphany moment, a manifestation of God's presence to the people, and so it fits in well with the celebration of Christmas and Epiphany. May every day of your life be an epiphany moment in which you become aware of God's presence in your life.

**Myšlenky:** Svátek Křtu Páně zakončuje vánoční dobu jako důležitá připomínka toho, kdo je vlastně tento Ježíš, jehož narození jsme slavili a stojí na začátku doby "během roku", která postupně rozvíjí vhled do Ježíšova učení. Ostatně zařazení textu o Ježíšově křtu u synoptiků na začátek Ježíšovy veřejné činnosti není pouhý historický záměr, nemá nám jen připomenout, jak věci byly, ale je to jakési prvé a hlavní "představení" hlavní postavy evangelií, v zásadě důležitější a obsažnější, než texty o Ježíšově dětství u Lukáše a Matouše. Ukazují Ježíše v prvé řadě jako člověka, který se ještě ke všemu staví do řady s hříšníky, což je opravdu pohoršlivé i pro Jana Křtitele. Ale tento Ježíš se nestaví s hříšníky do řady jen tak pro nic za nic. Jde mu totiž o naplnění "veškeré spravedlnosti". A slovo "spravedlnost" má v Bibli jiný význam, než v právu. Nejde zde o to, "dát každému, co jeho jest", ale jde o bezpodmínečné podřízení se Boží lásce, o naplnění vůle Otcovy. A toto naplnění vůle Otcovy je hlavním motivem Ježíšovy solidarity s hříšníky a celé jeho činnosti. Je to milovaný Syn, jenž se přiřazuje ke kajícím hříšníkům. A je to Syn, jednající nadále jen a pouze v síle Ducha. Ten, který je zcela Boží (svou vůlí i Duchem) - a ten, který je blízko ztraceným, totiž hříšníkům - Spasitel. Blízký zřejmě těm, kteří nejen, že jsou na dně či blízko dna, ale hledajícím cestu z tohoto dna. Takový je Ježíš - tehdy i nyní. A taková má být zřejmě církev, nositelka Ježíšova poslání v této době. Ne vnucující se, ne hrající si na společenství ztroskotanců, ani na společnost elitní - ale co nejvíc Boží, plná Ducha a jako taková blízká těm, kdo hledají cestu, z bídy hříchu z bídy svého poničeného lidství.
