Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! How is your season of Lent coming along? What are you doing different during this time of year to help you to live this season and prepare yourself for the celebrations of Holy Week and Easter? Are you attending Stations of the Cross every week? Are you preparing yourself to make a good confession sometime during this Lenten Season? Let us do all we can to make this time a special time of year and so that we may become better Christians.

On Thursday, March 19, we will have Mass at 6:00 pm to celebrate the Feast Day of St. Joseph. Please come and join us for Mass and then go to the PAC for the blessing of the St. Joseph Altar and enjoy a wonderful meal. Spend time in fellowship with one another and reflect upon the life of St. Joseph and his witness of faith and trust in God.

Next Sunday at the 10:30 Mass we will celebrate the **Sacrament of Confirmation with Fr. James Misko**, **Vicar General of the Diocese of Austin**. Please pray for our confirmandi as they make final preparation for this Sacrament and try to come to the Confirmation Mass to support our youth as they receive the gift of the Holy Spirit and make a commitment to profess their faith to all they meet.

In today's gospel, Jesus goes up to the woman at the well and speaks to her, a Samaritan, someone who is alienated and despised by the Jews. On top of this, the woman was probably rejected by her own people because of the life of adultery which she had been living. This can be seen by the time of day in which she went to get the water. Usually women would get water in the early morning hours before it was hot. Those who were outcasts had to go later in the day, usually around noon. Yet, despite what other people would have thought, Jesus speaks to her. Jesus shows His apostles that His message is for all people, not just for the Jews. The woman accepts Jesus as the Messiah and has faith in Him and begins to proclaim Jesus' name to all the people of Shechem. Once they hear Jesus, they too have a conversion experience and have faith in Him.

When we hear the message of Jesus and receive Him in Holy Communion, do we undergo a conversion experience? Do we grow closer to Him and is our faith strengthened? Maybe first we need to know what faith is. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that: "Faith is the theological virtue by which we believe in God and believe all that he has said and revealed to us, and that [we believe all His] Holy Church proposes for our belief, because he is truth itself. By faith 'man freely commits his entire self to God.' For this reason, the believer seeks to know and do God's will. Living faith works through charity." It also says that Christian faith "is to confess that Jesus is Lord." What does all this mean? For a person to have faith they must commit themselves to doing the will of God in their life and they must proclaim the message of Jesus Christ to others, by word and by example, and they must do good works as an expression of that faith. If we have true faith in Jesus Christ, then we will believe all that He has revealed to us and we will believe all that the Church teaches in regard to faith and morals. This is what it means to be filled with faith in Jesus Christ. All of us, including myself, can always grow in faith. We are not a perfect people. And that is what this season of Lent is all about: reflecting on our lives and our relationship with Jesus Christ and asking ourselves how we can grow closer to Him and how we can grow in faith. Like the woman at the well we first need to admit our sinfulness, the things which we have done wrong in our life and then seek out the ways in which the Lord is calling us to change. The best way to do this is by receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, by going to confession. The dates and times of Penance Services in our parish and the surrounding parishes is in the bulletin. Please take advantage of this opportunity and attend one of these services and receive the love and forgiveness of God through His Son Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

In today's gospel we heard how Jesus gave the woman living waters, He gave her Himself. Today, Jesus wants to give us this living water, He wants to give us His own body and blood. As we receive Him into our lives let us ask Him to increase our faith, to give us the courage and strength to proclaim His message to other people and to express this faith through the good works that we do.

Celebrate the Feast of Saint Joseph

on Thursday, March 19, with Mass at 6:00 p.m., followed by a *St. Joseph's Altar Celebration* in the PAC

sponsored by the *Confraternity of Christian Mothers*

The Altar will be blessed by Fr. Stephen and then participants will be able to enjoy the meatless foods provided on the altar.

In keeping with tradition, donations for those in need will be appreciated for the benefit of the Caring Place in Georgetown.

The farmers looked out across their barren fields, sweat beading down their faces from the hot sun and a cloudless sky. Dried-out crops popped beneath their feet. As they walked across fields that should be spotted with the bright colors of life, dust kicked up around their legs. They looked to the sky, searching for a cloud, but none were in sight. It was the 1600s and a great famine had set in for the great agricultural island of Sicily.

With no rain, no crops, and barely a single hope left, the people of Sicily began to pray. They turned to St. Joseph, their patron saint, and pleaded for rain. In return, they vowed to honor St. Joseph with a large and plentiful feast. After what seemed like an eternity of unanswered prayers, the heavens finally burst open like an overfilled wine cask and the rain poured down upon dusty fields and withered crops.

To honor their promise, the Sicilian farmers prepared a grand feast. The grand feast became a tradition throughout Sicily and Italy, and is now known as the St. Joseph's Altar. On March 19, St. Joseph's feast day, Italians carried on the tradition and, when many immigrated to America, they brought the tradition with them. Today, many parishes still celebrate St. Joseph's Altar on March 19.

Regardless of heritage or nationality, Catholics across the world have embraced the tradition as a very real reminder of the blessings bestowed upon us by God through the intercession of His saints. It's a day to celebrate and share those blessings, yet it is also a day to celebrate the family. It was the family that God chose for His Son to begin the work of salvation, and He chose St. Joseph as the patriarch of this family. This is why St. Joseph was chosen as the patron saint of families. In the Holy Family of St. Joseph, Mary, and Jesus, we find the perfect example for all Christian families to reflect.

Join us in celebrating the family on the Feast Day of the Patron Saint of Families, Fathers, and the Universal Church, St. Joseph!
