Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

Every Thursday in the church from 3 – 9 p.m.

Masses have been re-opened to the public, but with safety precautions. In order to keep social distancing and occupancy at the mandated levels within the church, we have implemented some barriers and have added 2 more weekend Masses (see schedule above). We appreciate you maintaining a 6 ft social distance from your neighbor (families can sit together) and keeping an empty pew in between (as are currently roped off). Seating is obviously going to be limited right now, so if you come into the church and all the available seating is taken, we apologize and ask for your understanding. Our ushers will be available to try to accommodate as many people as possible at each Mass. We also ask that you please wear a mask while inside the church building and use the provided hand sanitizer. While everyone is always welcome at Mass, we encourage those who are at or over 65 years of age, or have compromised immune systems or underlying health conditions, to either use extra precaution if attending, or simply continue to stay at home for a while longer (and continue to watch our Masses on our Facebook page – as they will still be live streamed until further notice). A dispensation continues for those who are unable to attend Mass during this time.

RCIA: Class this Tuesday, May 12, at 7:00 p.m. in the RE Bldg. Topic of discussion: Eschatology – The End Times. Please continue to pray for our candidates as they prepare to receive their Sacraments.

Pro-Life Adoration: we have resumed Adoration on Thursdays! Come spend some time with the Lord, present in the Blessed Sacrament, this Thursday, May 14, from 3 – 9 pm. You may be aware that last week Pope Francis called on believers of all religions to unite in a **Day of Prayer, Fasting and Works of Charity** this Thursday, May 14. This day of prayer is intended to implore God to help humanity overcome the coronavirus pandemic. Bishop Vásquez joins Pope Francis by asking you to encourage the faithful to stand together during this time of pandemic for peace, humanity and solidarity, specifically on May 14.

We will have a special Mass for our **First Holy Communicants** next Sunday, May 17, at 2:00 p.m. Please pray for the children as they receive the Blessed Sacrament, for the first time, and may their spirits be filled with the grace of our Lord.

Dear friends in Christ,

He is Risen! He is truly Risen! Here we are on this 5th Sunday of Easter. This Easter Season is passing very quickly. Let us continue to take some time each day to reflect upon the meaning of Jesus' resurrection in our lives of faith.

It is truly a great blessing to have many of you here once again. Hopefully soon we will be able to have a full church every Sunday and the restrictions are eased up during this coronavirus pandemic. May God keep all of us well and joyful.

A very happy **Mothers' Day** to all of our mothers. Thank you to all mothers who give faithful witness in what it means to be a mother, especially according to the example of our Blessed Mother, Mary. Each day you say "yes" to God in living your vocation as a wife and mother recognizing your special calling from God. You make daily sacrifices of time for your children. You deny yourself material things so that your children may have what they need. You continue to love and serve your children even when they do not obey you and when they do not show you respect. For all that you do and for the love you give to us, we say "Thank you!". I hope and pray that you have a very blessed and joyful Mothers' Day

During this Easter Season we continue to read from the Gospel of John. In today's Gospel there is a dialogue between Jesus and Thomas and Philip. Jesus says that He is going to prepare a place for His disciples and that where He is going they know the way. Thomas asks Jesus how they can know the way. "Jesus said to him, 'I am the way and the truth and the life." What does this mean to you? With Jesus there is only one way, one truth and one life. In today's Gospel, John tells us how Jesus had to redirect the focus of the Apostles. Jesus seems to be a little frustrated with the Apostles because he tells Philip, "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip?" Jesus probably gets frustrated with each of us in the same way many times and has to do something to get us focused on Him again.

All three readings of today show us that even the apostles and other disciples, a weak and imperfect people, very much like you and I, needed to be focused on their mission: to bring mankind into the mystery of Jesus Christ. This was their mission and this is our mission as Church today. We are a community of Christ people making our way to the Father. We have been commissioned by Jesus Christ to stand up for the things of God: for justice, charity, peace, humility, chastity and the other virtues, but our main commissioning is to grow in prayer and in the Word of God. If we do not pray and read Scripture, then we cannot become a people of virtue. We will always make mistakes in life but let not these mistakes be the result of pride and vanity. For we are accountable to God for what we do in life. As long as we do our best and try to follow the ways of Jesus, praying, reading Scripture, and being obedient to God, then we can be certain that we are doing what is right and that we are on our way to God the Father.

Here on earth we are the Mystical Body of Christ, Christ is the Head and we are Its members. We are the presence of Jesus Christ on earth. We make Christ present to one another and to all other peoples. When we are accountable to Christ in the mystery of His Church, it is then that we are safe in our focus. It is then that we will know the way to the Father. For we will be embracing the Truth of the Father that comes to us in the person of Jesus Christ. For Jesus said, "Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me." When we embrace the Truth of the Father in the person of Jesus Christ, then and only then can we say that Jesus is our total life and our focus forever in our way to the Father. Let us then keep our focus on Jesus as we offer Him to the Father and as we receive Him in the Eucharist at Mass.
