Catholic Social Teaching Corner: In today's Gospel, we are encouraged to be fearless in the face of opposition. We have a responsibility to contribute to society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom. Even when others attempt to misguide us, we must remember that we are the Lord's own. We must trust in God and proclaim our faith boldly.

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Thank you to everyone who helped with our Corpus Christi Procession last Sunday. Thank you especially to those who set up the outdoor altars. All was beautifully done as we gave honor to our Lord. Summer begins this weekend and the summertime break for schools is about 1/3 completed. May all of our children enjoy the remaining summer break whether it be taking vacation with family or working on the farm or working around the house and yard or working at a local business.

Speaking of local business, please try to support our local businesses. Many are owned by our parishioners and they would appreciate your support. Most of what you need is available locally, whether it's tires, hardware and other home and garden needs, liquor, and the list goes on. Go and visit them and see what they have. You may be surprised.

Please pray for those who will be ordained priests next Saturday. It is always a time of great joy to see young men devote and commit their lives to Jesus and His Church in service as priests. Pray they will always be faithful and joyful priests, giving true witness to what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ.

"Dear Lord, I want to thank you for being with me so far today. With your help, I have not been impatient, or lost my temper, or been mean, cantankerous, grumpy, or judgmental. But now, Lord, I'm really going to need your help, because, in a just few minutes I'll be getting out of bed!" Are we afraid to live our faith, to give faithful witness to our Lord during the day?

In today's First Reading, Jeremiah was afraid, but he trusted in God to give him the strength and courage needed to preach the truth and not to compromise the truth.

Jesus knew the apostles would be weak and that sometimes they would be afraid to speak the truth. In today's gospel, Jesus reassures them that God will take care of them. Be not afraid, just be faithful. Many times, we are more concerned about our physical well-being and the things of this life than we are about spending eternal life with God in Heaven.

When we begin to focus too much upon the material things of this world and providing for our own needs, then we begin to be afraid, and we quickly forget that as long as we are faithful to God our needs will be provided. But we must not forget to do our part. This is what Jesus is telling His apostles.

Today we celebrate Fathers' Day. I would think that being a father would be frightening at times. Jesus tells you today do not be afraid, be faithful. This is one of the most important things that fathers can teach their children. No matter what happens to you in life or what situations you find yourself in, just be faithful and trust that God is with you. But, yet, this is not what some teach their children. This is not what some priests, as spiritual Fathers, teach their parishioners. And why...because teaching the truth oftentimes brings challenges and sometimes brings confrontation. Many want to avoid these challenges, or confrontations, so they only say what makes people feel comfortable. It's time we moved out of our comfort zone.

Living together before marriage, marriage outside the church, contraception, surgical sterilization, missing Mass on Sunday, etc. Many parents tell their children this is all ok when, in reality, it is sinful. Doing these things is not being faithful.

When we are not faithful, not following the teachings of Jesus and His Church, then we are, in essence, denying God. Remember what Jesus says in today's Gospel: "Everyone who acknowledges me before others, I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father."

Let us begin by acknowledging God within our own families by teaching what should be taught and living what should be lived. Be not afraid.
