EIM WORKSHOP (during pandemic) - EIM Policies require all clergy, religious, seminarians, employees and adult volunteers serving in a ministry requiring EIM compliance to submit an EIM Application for Ministry (one-time only) and attend an EIM Workshop at least once every three years. Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace of and love of our Lord be with each of you. I hope everyone is enjoying this summer. Try to keep hydrated and cool in all this heat.

Important news: We are in the process of purchasing the land that is for sale behind the Office/RE building. It is 3.3221 acres of land. Purchasing this land is important since anyone who lives there must use our driveway to access it and we can have it for additional future use by the cemetery and the completion of our Parish grounds. I will keep all of you informed with the progress of this purchase and what we will be doing with the land in the future. Let us all pray that whatever we use it for will be according to the will of God.

In today's Gospel we hear several parables about the Kingdom of Heaven. The first is about sowing seeds, similar to last Sunday's Gospel. When the seeds began to grow there were weeds mixed in with the wheat. Some thief had come and sown bad seeds. The second parable is about the mustard seed and its comparison to how the Kingdom of Heaven grows as the mustard plant grows into a large bush. The third parable is about the woman who mixes yeast and flower to produce a leavened loaf of bread. So, all these parables are about the growing of the Kingdom of Heaven. In the process the good and bad must grow together, but, in the end the bad weeds will be separated from the good wheat and the weeds will be burned up in fire. In the world we see many good and bad people. We often wonder why God allows both and not just the good to continue to live. All are given the opportunity to accept His love and to respond to that love. Those who refuse will not enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Accepting and responding to His love means that we follow His teachings and that we live those teachings each day, praising God for His goodness and also doing good deeds for others. In other words, we cannot sit idle. If we do, then the weeds begin to grow within us. We must actively live our faith by going to Mass every weekend, and, when possible, on weekdays, following the Commandments, reading the Bible, praying every day, going to confession, doing what the Church asks of us, and loving others as God loves us. May we grow into the tallest of plants in our Catholic Faith and produce what is good for all and for the Kingdom of God. If we do not, then Jesus makes very clear what the consequences will be for us. May we all "shine like the sun in the kingdom of the Father."

K úvaze: "Trochu kvasu všechno těsto prokvasí" (1 Kor 5,6). Tato "empirická pravda" je nám důvěrně známá z běžného života, a proto bychom ji ani nemuseli vyčíst z Písma. Kvas, symbolizující něco velmi nepatrného, má tu úžasnou vlastnost, že prokvasí i velké množství těsta. Z tohoto důvodu je v Bibli oblíbeným symbolem jak "zla" (hříchu), tak i "dobra" (Božího království přítomného v Kristových slovech a činech).

Podobenství o kvasu nás ujišťuje, že Kristova přítomnost je účinná a "pracuje", třebas skrytě. A co víc: je to kvas účinný, který má v sobě "sílu" prokvasit celé těsto - nejen nějakou jeho část. Celé těsto: nejen náš mikrosvět (naše myšlení - kolikrát stereotypní?, jednání, vztahy - někdy "zablokované"?), ale i makrosvět (svět kultury, politiky, ekonomie... - není pro nás "nestravitelným soustem", že Boží království by mohlo proměnit i tyto "veličiny"?).

Toto velmi prostinké podobenství nás vyvádí z ducha poraženectví, že kvas zla nezadržitelně prokvasí naši společnost: je tu totiž také jiný kvas, možná méně nápadný, ale zato velmi účinný.

Bylo by nešťastné, kdybychom zkoumali, co může evangelium prokvasit a co ne. Podobenství o kvasu je pro nás především povzbuzením, že Kristovo slovo může prokvasit opravdu všechno (i ty "sebevíc beznadějné" lidi či oblasti naší společnosti). Na nás je, abychom nechali působit tento kvas již přítomný v nás: nechali "prokvasit" čili "prostoupit a proměnit" celou tu síť našich vztahů ... (Pastorace.cz)
