Catholic Social Teaching Corner – August 1/2 - 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time: In today's Gospel, we hear the story of how Jesus fed the crowds with just five loaves of bread and two fish. "They all ate and were satisfied," Matthew writes. Jesus does similar things with the small gifts we present to Him. When we share our own gifts of time and talent, Jesus takes them, blesses them and multiplies them for the benefit of all. Have you thought about your gifts and how you can share them?

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Thank you to everyone who participated in the 2000 Hail Mary Day of Prayer and Petition. There was an excellent turnout all throughout the day. Thank you especially to the Legion of Mary who organized and led the day of prayer. We appreciate their ministry. May we all continue to pray for Mary's intercession in asking her Son to rid the world of the evils of our day.

We have closed the deal to purchase the property behind the RE/Office Building. So, you can subtract \$239,000.00 from the account balances we gave you last week in our Annual Financial Report. Now we will decide on what is the best way to use this land and how to clear out all the brush and buildings.

Food is a very important part of a person's life. Some people's lives are centered on food. A lack of food leads to starvation and many times will even lead to wars. In the Scriptures, food is associated with important events and has various meanings. These range from the forbidden fruit in the Garden of Eden, where food symbolized wisdom and temptation, to manna in the desert, where it symbolized God's provision for the people. The Passover meal was a vivid commemoration of rescue from slavery. The Maccabees' refusal to eat the flesh of the pig signified their faithfulness to the Law, even in the face of death. Having a meal with Martha and Mary shows Jesus relaxing with friends. Eating with Zacchaeus, Jesus demonstrates his regard for people often overlooked. His dining with tax-collectors and sinners is a statement of who the Son of Man came to save. And in the miracles of the loaves and fish, food is a sign of blessing and abundance.

In today's Gospel, a huge crowd is fed and there is an abundance of food left over. When Jesus performs this miracle and ministers to the people, he ministers not only to their soul, but to their whole person, to their physical bodies. He does this not by Himself, but with the help of the apostles. He gets them involved in what He is doing. At first, the apostles aren't too willing to get involved. They tell Jesus, "This is a deserted place and it is already late; dismiss the crowds so that they can go to the villages and buy food for themselves." And when Jesus tells them to give them something to eat, they say, "We have nothing here, but five loaves and a couple of fish." Like us, the apostles are full of excuses to get out of helping the people and to keep from getting involved. But Jesus wants His disciples to be part of this miracle. He wants to teach the apostles that they are to have a hand in lifting a suffering mankind up and out of distress. As His followers, Jesus is saying the same thing to you and me. Today, Jesus is telling us:

You, my people, you who claim to be my followers, you "give them something to eat." And, when the proper moment comes, you must be ready to help get a miracle out to whomever might be hurting. Then you, my own people, will be pleasing to me. For you will be helping with miracles, not merely standing around watching an astonishing event.

And so, as we live and move and struggle through this life, we ought to be alert to those moments when Christ Jesus expects us to become, in His name, a bit of a miracle worker. In order for us to be this miracle worker, then we need to let go of our own egos, our pride, so that it is Jesus Christ, and Jesus Christ alone, who is working these miracles through us. We are only His instruments.

Today we come to this sacred meal to be fed by our Lord. We who come have responded to the call of God in today's first reading taken from the Book of the prophet Isaiah. "All you who are thirsty, come to the water! You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat.... Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life. I will renew within you the everlasting covenant, the benefits assured to David." We are like the 5,000 people in today's gospel. We come to our Lord thirsty, poor, and hurt. He looks upon us with pity and feeds us His own Body and Blood in this most sacred meal which we call the Eucharist. Till the end of time Jesus gives Himself as food to billions of people. Through us and billions of others Jesus provides food and material and spiritual aid to billions more. A miracle being worked out by Jesus through you and me. Come, let us receive Him.

K úvaze: Pokud jsme pozorně naslouchali evangelnímu textu, postřehli jsme, že učedníci dali Kristu to, co měli, aby pak přijímali a dávali dál. Pro toho, kdo se dává Kristu k dispozici, je životně důležité umět od Krista přijímat, čerpat, a nesnažit se rozdávat z toho mála, co každý má, bez Krista! Našich pět chlebů samozřejmě nepostačí pro tolik lidí, nepostačí dlouhodobě. Brzy bychom se vyčerpali, skončili s prázdnou (neměli bychom ani pro sebe, ani pro druhé!) a "vyhořeli".

Před těmi, kdo nechají "zlomit" své srdce při pohledu na zástupy, kdo neutečou, aby neslyšeli Ježíšův hlas, stojí velkolepé poslání: dávat Kristu, přijímat a sytit druhé (Kristovým slovem, ale i "obyčejným slovem útěchy, naděje", skutkem lásky, hmotnými dary). A stát se svědky zázraku, který neuvidí ti, kdo si ponechají (ze strachu? z nedostatku soucitu? víry?) svých pouhých pět chlebů pro sebe. (Pastorace.cz)
