Don't be afraid to leave your comfort zone by joining a jail or prison ministry team; writing or talking with a legislator; studying Catholic teachings that make you uncomfortable; allowing a poor person to befriend you; becoming a foster family. Jesus sends us to proclaim the Gospel to the ends of the earth; sometimes that might not even mean leaving our town or city. How is Jesus calling you to leave your comfort zone?

A CEF "Back to School" Spiritual Bouquet Enrollment drive will be held after Masses this weekend, August 8/9, and next, August 15/16, in the foyer of the church, for those wishing to enroll their children, grandchildren, catechists, teachers, etc, as they begin another school year soon. Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! The summer is "flying by", as they say. Soon school will begin though it may begin in a much different way than in years past due to the Coronavirus. Please pray for all teachers and students as they prepare for a new school year. We pray that the Holy Spirit will shower upon them His gifts of wisdom, knowledge, and understanding.

This week we celebrate a **Holy Day as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven**. Mass will be on Friday, August 14, at 7:00 pm, and Saturday, August 15, at 8:30 am. Let us gather together to worship our Lord as we honor His Mother.

How good of listener are you? Have you ever tried to listen to someone who whispered to you in a crowded room? If you have, you know how carefully you had to listen to what they were saying. You may have even found it impossible to hear what they were saying to you. Our first reading today reminds us that God speaks to us in unexpected ways. If our lives are so full that our minds are cluttered with thoughts and feelings, we may miss hearing the Lord speak to us. Listening attentively is essential for our spiritual growth.

We live in a very noisy world that competes for our attention. Most of us have learned to tune out or ignore many of life's noises when we are not deliberately paying attention to them. Unfortunately, we begin to not listen to anything we hear. But, if we desire to be attentive to God we need to set aside time to be with God. Listening requires not only that we hear the words of Scripture, but that we also pay attention to what is happening within us as we listen. This is a process of having a Spiritual Awareness of the presence of God and His speaking to us. Maybe we need to ask the question if we are drawn by God by what we hear, or, do we turn away from Him? Does what we hear bring us joy or make us fearful?

Do you ever feel that you are being called to walk on the waters, as was St. Peter, to face your own fears? Do you think that you can face these fears alone and do not need God, that you can save yourself? What risk is God inviting you to take in your life? These are only a few possible questions that you could ask yourself after hearing today's gospel. Are you really listening to Jesus, and what He is really saying, or, are you only listening to what you want Him to be saying? Maybe this was Peter's problem in today's Gospel. Also, are you really listening to God as did Elijah in the quietness of His whisper? Are you listening with your heart as well as your ears?

By taking time to reflect regularly on our lives, we can learn to listen when God speaks to us in various ways — through prayer, through Scripture, through the Mass, through our family and friends, or just through the silence as we are before His presence in the Blessed Sacrament. You may want to reflect upon what it was that brought you joy on any given day. Or, you may want to reflect upon what caused distress in your life, and just how did you talk with God about the things that happened in your life. Spending time in prayer will give you the opportunity to separate yourself from the noise and clutter of your life and come before God in the silence of your heart. When you give yourself to God, you will discover that God is everywhere you go, He is within you, He is all around you in the beauty of nature and in the people you meet, and in all your experiences of life. Are you listening, are you hearing God's voice in your life? If not, what is keeping you from listening?

Many people ask questions about the Church's teaching on important issues like abortion, sterilization, in vitro fertilization, vasectomy, tubal ligations, gay marriage, end of life issues, feeding tubes, breathing tubes, and many others. It is important to know what the Church teaches about these topics. For information, you can go to the Catechism of the Catholic Church and also to an excellent website www.ncbcenter.org (National Catholic Bioethics Center). This website will answer most, if not all, of your questions. Please take some time to explore it and be up-to-date on these issues.
