

Catholic Social Teaching Corner – August 22/23 – 21st **Sunday in Ordinary Time:** Jesus entrusted the keys of the Kingdom to Peter, who represents the whole Church – all of us. What are those keys? ... the authority passed on from Jesus to Peter as head of the Chruch. This means that all of us and each of us are called to be poor in spirit and meek, we are to hunger and thirst for righteousness; we are to show mercy and be peacemakers, we will mourn, and we will experience persecution. We are called to love as God loves – without counting the cost and without exception. How will you witness to God's love this week? To whom are you called to show love?

We will have our monthly **Faith Formation Collection** this weekend (August 22/23) which allows us to provide necessary resources for the education of children in our CCE program, participants in the RCIA program, the continued education of adults, etc.

The **Confraternity of Christian Mothers will meet** today (Sunday, August 23) in the RE Bldg following the 8:30 a.m. Mass. All ladies of the parish are invited to attend, and all are asked to wear face masks.

Holy Hour of Reparation every Thursday at 7:30 a.m. (after the 7 a.m. Mass), in the presence of the Lord, inside the church. We follow a beautiful, timeless, relevant Catholic Church approved booklet that will be provided for you each week. This is a good opportunity to pray for the world and for our families. Give the Lord your time and spend an hour in His presence to pray to His Heart.

Pro-Life Eucharistic Adoration every Thursday from 3–9 p.m. in the church. Come and spend some time with the Lord, present in the Blessed Sacrament.



This year our CCE Program will be **<u>BUILDING ON GOD'S WORD</u>**. Our program may look different, but the content is still the same – passing the Catholic faith along to the next generation. <u>**Registration is open and**</u>, **<u>in order for your child(ren) to receive credit for a full year of catechesis, they need to have been registered</u> <u>by August 22!</u>** Please call the Faith Formation office if you have not done so.

Remember, in our Diocese, Sacrament preparation is a two-year process, so if your child is in first or eighth grade, they need to be in a program now so that they can be sufficiently prepared to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist in Second Grade and Confirmation in Ninth Grade.

We will have our 5th Sunday Second Collection next weekend, August 29/30, for the benefit of our Social Ministry Fund, which supports the Caring Place in Georgetown, the Jarrell Food Pantry and our local community needs.

RCIA Classes Begin September 8: RCIA is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults -- a process for welcoming new members into the Roman Catholic Church. It is a community journey that leads to a transformation of mind and spirit. The RCIA is mainly for non-Catholics who want to become Catholic, but adult Catholics who have not received all of the Sacraments (Communion, Confession, Confirmation) may also come into full communion with the Church through the RCIA process. Also, anyone who is already Catholic and would like to learn more about their faith is welcome to attend the classes, which will be held every Tuesday evening at 7:00 pm. in the PAC bldg beginning on Tuesday, September 8. Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. This week we celebrate some important saints. Monday, August 24 - St. Bartholomew; Thursday, August 27 - St. Monica; Friday, August 28 - St. Augustine; and, this coming Saturday, August 29, is the feast day of The Passion of St. John the Baptizer. He gave his life to prepare the way for Jesus. Let us ask him to pray for us that we have the same courage and desire to serve our Lord.

In today's Gospel, Peter makes a profound profession of faith. Jesus asked the apostles, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter, being the leader and spokesperson for the apostles, says, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." He recognizes Jesus for who He is. Jesus says to Peter in reply, "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Jesus does not say such a thing to anyone else, only to Peter. Peter is the rock, petra, upon which Jesus builds His Church. Jesus also gives Peter the "keys to the kingdom of heaven." These are not visible keys like you use to unlock something with, these are spiritual keys. Keys referring to authority and power. Jesus is telling Peter that He is giving him the same authority and power that He has Himself. Wow!

Peter would need this authority and power to be the first leader of the Church, to be the first Pope, and to organize the Church according to the Will of Jesus. This can be clearly seen in Paul's letters and especially in the letters of Timothy and Titus where it speaks about qualifications for bishops, presbyters (priests), and deacons. This shows that the Church was well organized before the deaths of Peter and Paul. Peter passed the "keys to the kingdom" on to the next bishop of Rome, St. Linus. This authority and power has been passed on to our current Pope Francis. What a great gift Jesus gave to His Church. Because of this, we can be sure that the teachings of the Catholic Church are what Jesus taught His apostles and has been passed on for 2000 years. With this authority given by Jesus, the Church continues to instruct us on matters of faith and morals so that we know that as new questions arise concerning faith and morals, that were not present at the time of Jesus, the Church has the authority to speak about them and present to us the teachings of the Church and try to understand them when the Church speaks on modern moral questions. Jesus guaranteed He would lead the Church founded on the rock of Peter, the Catholic Church, through the Holy Spirit.

K úvaze: "Co si lidé myslí?" To je věčná otázka. A tato otázka nebyla cizí ani Ježíšovi. Jenže - co si lidé myslí, to není totéž, jako poznání pravdy. Ježíš je Mesiáš. To je vyjádření srozumitelné židům. Pro ně byl Mesiáš očekávanou postavou, člověkem, který měl napravit zlé věci. Tyto zlé věci byly důsledkem hříchu a náprava znamenala návrat do dobrého stavu, v jakém byl svět stvořen. Mesiáš přišel především pro židy a skrze ně se měla spása rozšířit dál.

Druhé označení Ježíš - Syn Boží je naopak označení srozumitelné pohanům. Syn Boží je ten, kdo je nade všechny, kdo zná a ví více než ostatní. Syn Boží je rozhodně důležitější než všichni panovníci a než jakékoliv uznávané postavy v pohanském světě.

Kdo je tedy pro nás Ježíš - Mesiáš? Především ten, kdo přináší odpuštění. Odpuštění v míře, se kterou se ve světě nesetkáme. Dále je tím, kdo přináší naději. A naděje, kterou přináší Ježíš, není ohraničená smrtelností člověka. Ježíš nám také ukazuje lidsky pochopitelným způsobem, kdo je Bůh. A jenom skrze Ježíše nacházíme plný smysl utrpení, kterému se člověk nevyhne. Konečně i naše smrt získává průhlednost a smysl teprve díky Ježíši. To je jen několik bodů, které naznačují, kým pro nás Ježíš je. A v tomto smyslu máme o něm naším bližním svědčit. Vrcholným svědkem pak může a má být ten, kdo je Petrovým nástupcem - římský biskup, papež. Ani on nemůže být z úkolu být Ježíšovým svědkem vyňat. A ani on se nevyhne situacím, ve kterých není mnohými jeho svědectví přijímáno. Přes to všechno svědčit, že Ježíš je Mesiáš, je úkolem, který v dějinách stále trvá. (Pastorace.cz)
