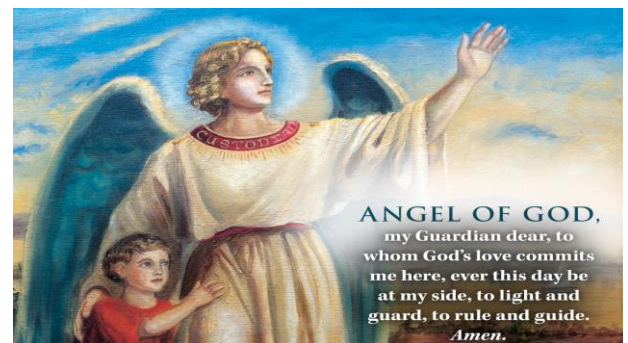

Catholic Social Teaching Corner – September 26/27 – 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time: In the Gospels, Jesus is always challenging the boxes we like to create, like the boxes for “good” and “bad”. Annual Cemetery Dues: The contribution, per family, of at least \$20, can be turned in using a ‘Cemetery Dues’ envelope (located by the bulletins or in your contribution envelope box). As written in our Cemetery Policies & Procedures: *“Annual contributions of at least \$20 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance. Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents’ home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund.”*

All Soul’s Memorial Envelopes are available by the bulletins and must be turned in by Wednesday, October 28. The names offered will be prayed for throughout the month of November.

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. Thank you to everyone who helped out with the preparing, cooking and boxing of the Bazaar To-Go Meal, the Raffle, the cakes and koláče bakers and sellers, parking and traffic flow, which was quite the challenge this year, and to those who counted the money, and those who helped clean up afterwards. We certainly have a talented cooking team here at Holy Trinity. Thank you for all your hard work. We hope to have the amount we made in the bulletin soon.

The month of October arrives this Thursday. October is Respect Life month so in a special way we celebrate the gift of life and we try to protect the sacredness of life through our prayers and our actions. We really need to pray for the conversion of hearts and minds so that all people will realize that all life, from the first moment of conception to natural death, is sacred and that we are all made in the image and likeness of God. Pray especially for those individuals who are standing in front of abortion clinics praying for those who are going to have their babies killed in their womb. Just their presence there in prayer oftentimes changes the minds of those who are going to these clinics. Many times those who work in these clinics undergo a change of heart and quit their jobs as they come realize the horror they are committing. May abortion come to an end one day in this country and throughout the world and may the evils of contraception also come to an end so that the life that God intends will be born into the world. During this month I encourage you to come on Thursday to spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament in Adoration praying for a greater respect for life in all its stages. Our Lord is calling you. Will you respond?

Please be sure to turn in your nominations for the **Pastoral Council by October 6**. All nominations must be EIM certified, meaning, that they must have attended an Ethics and Integrity in Ministry workshop within the last three years.

This week, Monday, September 28, is the feast of St. Wenceslaus. St. Wenceslaus (903-35), also known in Czech as Vaclav, was born near Prague, and was the son of Duke Wratislav. He was taught Christianity by his grandmother, St. Ludmila. The Magyars, along with Drahomira, an anti-Christian faction murdered the Duke and St. Ludmila, and took over the government. Wenceslaus was declared the new ruler after a coup in 922. He encouraged Christianity. Boleslav, his brother, no longer successor to the throne, after Wenceslaus' son was born, joined a group of noble Czech dissenters. In September of 935 a group of nobles allied with Wenceslaus' younger brother, Boleslav, in a plot to kill the prince. After Boleslav invited Wenceslaus to the feast of Saints Cosmas and Damian in Stará Boleslav, Boleslav and three of his companions – Tira, Čsta and Hněvsa – murdered Wenceslaus on his way to morning Mass. Boleslav thus succeeded him as the Duke (*kníže*) of Bohemia. He is the patron saint of the Czech Republic and Slovakia and his feast day is Sept. 28.

This Tuesday, September 29 is the feast of the Archangels - Sts. Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. Wednesday is the feast of St. Jerome, the priest who first translated the Bible from Hebrew and Greek to Latin. Thursday is the feast of St. Therese to the Child Jesus and Friday is the feast of The Holy Guardian Angels. Try to attend Mass on as many of these feast days as possible.

In today's Gospel you could say that Jesus is telling us that "actions speak louder than words". The Gospel is about two sons whose father told them to go and work in the vineyard. One said he would not go, but then went and worked in the vineyard. The other son said yes, I will go, but he did not go to work in the vineyard. Jesus tells them that the first son who said he would not go is the one who did the will of his father. So, Jesus is comparing these sons to the Pharisees and Scribes who say yes to God, but do not follow through with their actions, and, the tax collectors and prostitutes who at first say no to God by the way they live their life but once they hear Jesus preach they change their lives, seek forgiveness, and do what God is asking of them. Are we saying "yes" to God and then doing something that is completely opposite? We make a commitment to live the Commandments and to live according to the teachings of Jesus and His Church, but are we doing what we should be doing to live out this commitment? Most people are not! May God give us the strength and courage to live what we say we believe.

K ZAMYŠLENÍ: Je zajímavé slyšet Ježíšovo podobenství v běžných okolnostech našeho všedního života a srovnávat, nakolik se stáváme také my lidmi, kteří něco jiného říkají a jinak jednají. Avšak jiný význam nabývá stejná pasáž v kontextu vyhocené situace těsně před velikonočními svátky a zatčením Ježíše velekněžími. Zde už není čas na úvahy a výzvy. Jsou to poslední chvíle Kristova života a poslední možnosti pro velekněží, aby porozuměli. Ale i my se můžeme ptát, nakolik je naše křesťanství odpovědí na Ježíšova slova a nakolik jen formalizovaným rituálem. Ježíš nevyčítá nikomu, kdo hledá pravdu, víru, nasměrování života, i když při tom bloudí. Vždyť předchází místa evangelia svědčí o jeho snaze otevřít oči těm, kteří touží vidět. Řeč je o neochotě něco měnit. Právě obsah slova „chci“ je nejdůležitějším výrazem dnešního evangelia. Skutečné „chci“ znamená jednat. (Vira.cz)
