

Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."

All Soul's Memorial Envelopes are available by the bulletins and <u>must be turned in by Wednesday, October 28</u>. The names offered will be prayed for throughout the month of November.

Prayer Before the Election

Lord God, as the election approaches, we seek to better understand the issues and concerns that confront our city/state/country, and how the Gospel compels us to respond as faithful citizens in our community. We ask for eyes that are free from blindness so that we might see each other as brothers and sisters, one and equal in dignity, especially those who are victims of abuse and violence, deceit and poverty. We ask for ears that will hear the cries of children unborn and those abandoned, men and women oppressed because of race or creed, religion or gender. We ask for minds and hearts that are open to hearing the voice of leaders who will bring us closer to your Kingdom. We pray for discernment so that we may choose leaders who hear your word, live your love, and keep in the ways of your truth as they follow in the steps of Jesus and his Apostles and guide us to your Kingdom of justice and peace. We ask this in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ, and through the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Don't forget that this is Respect Life month. Continue to pray for those who are praying in front of abortion clinics, for those who are going there for abortions, and for those who are working for Planned Parenthood and other abortion facilities that are killing babies in the wombs of their mothers. May they have a conversion of heart and mind and may God's mercy be with them. May they see the evil that they are doing.

Our Second Reading today is Paul's letter to the Philippians. It is a letter of thanksgiving for the help he received from them while Paul was in prison in Rome. Paul has had to learn to adjust to many things. He says, "I know how to live in humble circumstances; I know also how to live with abundance. I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry, of living in abundance and of being in need."

Our problem is that most of us are so blessed with abundance, and do not even realize it. We may not even know what actual "being in need" is. We have homes, clothes, jobs and food. So few of us know what real "need" is. If we don't know such need, it's hard to believe the Church – or God – is needed at all. God and Church have become just one more luxury that we can seem to take or leave.

One parish had a wonderful man who showed up every morning before 6:00 a.m. daily Mass and saw to it that the doors were open, the lights were on, the candles were lit and everything was ready for Mass. He spoiled the priests of the parish. Frank was a salesman. Every day he wore a suit. Even on Saturday mornings when he did not go to work, Frank wore a suit.

One day Frank complained about the way they started to dress casually at the office. Frank had this philosophy: "I dress smartly, and I perform smartly. I dress casually, and I take my job casually." Frank connected the decline in a proper business attire with a decline in good job performance by younger salespeople.

Our Gospel today shows us one person in such clothing in trouble. It was the practice of the day to send out early notice to a family and friends that an event such as a wedding would be coming up. This gave people a chance to prepare.

Not only did people have to worry about proper attire, but also long distances might have to be covered – and oftentimes such events went on for days, not hours. Arrangements had to be made to take care of the flocks and farms, businesses and family members that would not be traveling.

The formal invitation which Jesus speaks of came at a moment's notice, so you had to pick up and leave immediately. If you were not ready, you lost out. One such person received his invitation but arrived unprepared. Being tossed out of the party may sound harsh to us who have become used to casual attire, but it was not in Jesus' day. You would never dishonor the host by dressing inappropriately, especially if the host were the king.

We have become a very casual society, and very few of us know what real hunger is. Do we really understand anymore what the Church really means to us? Or is the Church just another option to fill our time on Sundays?

Isaiah talks of the Kingdom as being a great feast. How can this mean anything to us if our every meal is a feast? We seemingly get by so well without the Church today that we may not be able to explain why we need it. In our casualness, going to church is no longer an event in a family's life. We simply throw something on, slide into the car and head off to Mass as if we were going to the store or to McDonald's or on any other errand. Clothing may not be important, but the attitude behind our choice of clothing is, so clothing is a sign of our attitude in regards to Mass and to God.

We have been invited by God to participate in something unbelievably powerful and life-giving. But like the king's original guests, we seem to have no reason to go. May the desire for God and for His Church grow within us each day so that we will always be prepared to come to the feast God prepares for us here on earth and eternally in heaven.

K úvaze: Nikdo z nás by nešel na svatbu v montérkách či teplákové soupravě. Velmi jasně bychom totiž vnímali závažnost takové události a nechtěli bychom zklamat očekávání hostitelů ... a přivodit si ostudu.

A takový příklad ze života by možná automaticky volal po "duchovní aplikaci", a sice že nesmíme přijít bez svatebních šatů na Boží hostinu. Musíme přijít "vhodně oblečeni". Takové moralizování ("musíš") je však cizí našemu podobenství. Tam se klade důraz na skvělou hostinu, na velkou nabídku. Na tuto hostinu mají královští služebníci zvát, ne nutit. Nenajdeme tam zmínku "musíte přijít na hostinu", ale najdeme: 'Řekněte pozvaným: Hostinu jsem přichystal, moji býci a krmný dobytek jsou poraženi, všechno je připraveno, pojďte na svatbu!' Hospodin, jako pravý gentleman, chce přilákat člověka jemně. On nabízí – a na pozvaném je, aby odpověděl. Nejen kladně, ale také přiměřeně. Nestačí totiž přijít na svatbu "v pracovním oblečení", to by bylo naprosto nemyslitelné. To by znamenalo, že dotyčný nepochopil, kam vlastně jde. Pokud ví, že se jedná o výjimečnou královskou hostinu, pak se "automaticky" vystrojí "královsky". A pokud nechápe vzácnost této nabídky ... pak není pomoci.

Pokud aspoň trochu pochopíme, co to je za privilegium smět na hostinu s Hospodinem, pak "automaticky" odpovíme přiměřeně. Takřka sami od sebe budeme vědět, jak se připravit na tuto hostinu. Vždyť každému z nás je jasné, že "noblesse oblige". (Pastorce.cz)
