#### Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Below is some very important information regarding our Parish projects.

Parish Plan Phase I & II Update: We are continuing with our Parish Plan Projects. Phase I takes care of entrance issues to the church and PAC, along with security and fire safety issues. Phase II includes the construction of a building next to the church on the north side that has restrooms and a choir room along with a porte cochere for easy drop off of those with mobility issues. It also includes updates made to the cry room and a new confessional that will be located where the current restrooms are. A bid has gone out to three contractors and the final selection will be on November 5. After that time we should have some sort of time schedule for this work to be completed.

Holy Trinity Painting Restoration Update: The restoration is be done by Brown Mountain Art and Antique Restoration in Dallas. It should take about 12 weeks to complete the work. Cost is \$12,100.00. Donations for this work would be greatly appreciated. Just put your donation in an envelope and mark on it "Holy Trinity Painting Restoration" and either mail it to us or put it in the collection basket or bring it to the office. Thank you!

Don't forget to continue to pray for a greater respect for life, from the moment of conception to natural death, during this Respect Life month. And being the month of the Rosary it would be good to offer your daily rosary for this intention. May our Blessed Mother Mary intercede for the lives of the unborn and may her prayers gain forgiveness for the horrible crimes being committed by the killing of babies in the wombs of their mothers through the procedure known as abortion. May the eyes of all people be opened to see the evils of abortion and all other evils against the dignity of life.

Today's readings speak to us about our relationship with God and our relationship to the things and people of this world. We learn from these readings that we belong to God and we are to give our full allegiance to Him. In other words we are to give Him our very selves. In the Gospel, we read where the Pharisees are trying to trap Jesus in what He is teaching, but, Jesus is too clever to be caught by the trap they have set. Instead, He gives a very wise answer that only makes the Pharisees all the angrier. He says that we are to give "to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." This is in response in their question about paying the census tax. We are made by and for God and we belong to God. Our first obligation is to Him. We should still fulfill our worldly obligations and be faithful to them as well, as long as they do not conflict with our obligations to God.

**K** úvaze: Dávat Bohu, anebo státu? Toto dilema nebylo aktuální pouze v Ježíšově době, ale i později - od starověku až po dobu nedávno minulou. Evangelium řeší dilema "Bůh, nebo stát" vyváženě - miska vah nepřevažuje ani na jednu, ani na druhou stranu: dávat nejen císaři, ale i Bohu (toto tvrzení chápejme dobře - samozřejmě víme, že Bohu patří víc než státu). Věřící tedy neopovrhuje politickou autoritou, ani nezůstává stranou problémů společnosti. Toto jasné biblické poselství je možné aplikovat mnoha způsoby. Chceme nyní poukázat na jednu cestu "přístupnou všem". Jen někteří věřící mohou aktivně vstupovat do politiky, jen někdy mohou občané přímo ovlivnit veřejné záležitosti (např. při volbách), ale všichni a vždycky mohou do nich zasahovat … nepřímo svojí modlitbou. To není nic nového, ale věc stará přinejmenším… jako Starý zákon. Tam nacházíme výzvu modlit se za říši babylónskou (a tím implicitně i za krále a hodnostáře! Jer 29,7). V Novém zákoně pak najdeme explicitní vybízení: "Na prvním místě žádám, aby se konaly prosby, modlitby, přímluvy, díkůvzdání za všechny lidi, za vládce a za všechny, kteří mají v rukou moc, abychom mohli žít tichým a klidným životem" (2 Tim 2,1.2). Tato modlitba není "výkřikem do tmy", ani posledním (a zbytečným) pokusem, když nic jiného není možné udělat. Je to modlitba, která se opírá o jistotu, že "Bohu patří moc" (Ž 62,12): on je tím suverénním vládcem a Pánem, před jeho moc se musí sklonit každé koleno (Iz 45,23.24; Fil 2,11). A proto "královo srdce je v Hospodinových rukou jako vodní toky, nakloní je, kam se mu zlíbí" (Př 21,1). Tedy Bůh může skrze naši modlitbu proměňovat i…politické činitele, jejich úmysly a plány!

Modlitbou za politické představitele dáváme Bohu, co je Boží (uznáváme jeho svrchovanou autoritu, převyšující jakoukoli politickou moc), a císaři to, co je císařovo (vyprošujeme mu Boží požehnání a vedení). A misky vah jsou opět v rovnováze.
