Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."

Praised be Jesus Christ! Now and forever! Don't forget to mark your calendars for our parish mission which will be the week of November 8-12.

Also, be sure to mark your calendars to attend Mass on all of the upcoming Holy Days. Please note the change of Mass times for Christmas and for Mary, Mother of God on New Years Eve.

As we begin month of November next Sunday, we will celebrate the **Feast of All Saints**. You could say that this begins our Holy Day and Holiday time of year.

We will celebrate **All Souls Day** on Monday, November 2, as we pray for all those who have died and are on their way to Heaven. We pray that they may quickly pass through the purifying process called Purgatory and soon join the saints in Heaven. Everyone is encouraged to attend Mass on All Souls Day.

We will also have a **Mass at the cemetery Saturday**, **November 7**, **at 11:00 am**, weather permitting. Let us all join together in remembering and praying for our loved ones who have died.

This month we have been celebrating Respect Life Month. In what ways have you been promoting the Gospel of Life during this month? Have you spoken about respect life issues with your children? Have you tried to increase your knowledge and understanding of respect life issues, such as, abortion, sterilization, contraception, death penalty, immigration, refugees, quality care for the elderly, assisted suicide, and much more. It is important that we know and understand the Church's teaching on these issues and that we teach them properly to others. Sometimes people only teach their own opinion on these topics and they distort what the Church teaches, therefore not giving good witness to the beauty and sound teaching of the Church. Take time to learn before you counsel other people on these issues.

This week's gospel continues last week's theme of putting God first in your life. Jesus tells us, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment." Do we really love God in this way? I think that we oftentimes try to fool ourselves into thinking that we love God above all things. But, if we are not being faithful to going to Mass every week and we do not read the Bible and we are not faithful to praying every day and we do not tithe, then we are not loving God as we should. May all of us seek to love God above all things. When we do love Him, then we will automatically love ourselves and one another.

Křesťané vyznávají, že toto zjevování Božích pravd o víře a vztahu člověka s Bohem vyvrcholilo v Kristu. Dnešní evangelium představuje Ježíšovo shrnutí této staletí rostoucí tradice kodexu jednání. Neobsahuje pouze vztah k člověku! První je vztah k Bohu. Začíná slovy o lásce: "Miluj!" A to je výzva, tedy nikoli všeobecné konstatování, co by se mělo, ale pokyn předpokládající skutky.

A pesar de extenderse a toda la humanidad, no está reducido a una expresión de amor genérica, abstracta, sin demandas, sino que pide mi propio y práctico compromiso aquí y ahora...el Amor por Dios y por el prójimo se ha convertido en uno: en el más pequeño de los hermanos encontramos a Jesús mismo, y en Jesús encontramos a Dios". (#15) ¿Quién es el prójimo que estamos llamados a amar en este momento? ¿Cómo mostraremos amor concreto por el prójimo?
