Your participation in this process is very important and appreciated.

This weekend we celebrate the **Feast of All Saints**'. We remember those who have died and are with God in Heaven. We will also celebrate **All Souls**' **Day** on Monday as we pray for all those who have died and are on their way to Heaven. We pray that they may quickly pass through the purifying process in Purgatory and soon join the saints in Heaven. During the month of November, we will be praying for these souls in a special way. We do this because of what we read in Sacred Scripture in passages that pertain to the Church's teaching on Purgatory: Praying for and making an offering for the dead - 2 *Maccabees* 12:43-46; *The need to make up for transgressions - Mt* 5:25-26, *Lk* 12:58-59; *nothing profane can enter heaven – Rev.* 21:27; *cleansing fire –* 1 *Cor* 3:12-15; *David, though forgiven, still punished for his* sin - 2 Sam12:13-14. Jesus paid the price for our sins in general, but we still must make up for the individual sins that we do. Let us pray that we can truly be one of those Holy Ones of God.

Also during this month, we remember those who have served our country as we celebrate **Veteran's Day** on November 11. We will also celebrate **Thanksgiving Day** on November 26. We have much for which we are thankful. Maybe during this month, we can count all of our blessings and give thanks to God from them.

Our **Parish Mission** with Fr. Lou Guardiola, CPM, will begin next Sunday evening, November 8. Take time each evening of the Mission to come and grow in your spiritual life and in your relationship with the Most Holy Trinity.

As we celebrate this day of **All Saints'**, we celebrate a day of giving glory to God by honoring His saints. Today the Church reminds us that God's call to holiness is universal, and all are called to live in His love and to make His love real in the lives of those around them. We live lives of holiness when we live lives of integrity and truth, living a life close to one another while being close to God.

There are many reasons why we should honor the saints:

- 1. The saints put their trust in Christ and lived heroic lives of faith. The saints enjoy heavenly bliss as a reward for their faith in Jesus.
- 2. The saints are our role models. They teach us by their lives that Christ's holy life of love, mercy, and unconditional forgiveness can be lived by ordinary people, of all walks of life and at all times.
- 3. The saints are our intercessors, who intercede for us before Jesus, who is the only intercessor between God and us. They can pray for us as we can pray for one another.
- 4. The saints are the instruments that God uses to work miracles in the world.

All Saints' Day is not only a day to remember the saints and to thank God for them, but it is also a day to ask for their help. This is a day to glorify Jesus Christ, who by His holy life and death has made the saints and us holy. This feast reminds us that anyone of us can become a saint if we strive to live our life as Jesus asks us. After all, in Matthew 7:21 Jesus says, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in Heaven." What is doing the will of the Father, it is living out the beatitudes that we heard in today's Gospel. It is living a life of humility and of obedience to God, keeping the Ten Commandments. This is what those who believe in Jesus do. Let us show our belief in Christ and keeping all He has taught us so that we may join the saints in Heaven.
