What Christ does for us in Holy Communion is shown by this Sacrament's sign: He comes to us in the form of a meal. As we must eat to maintain life, to grow and remain strong, so this food is the great means of growing in the life of grace. A preview of this food was the manna by which God kept the Israelites alive in the desert; Christ refers to this then tells us that He Himself will be the food that sustains the greater and eternal life of grace. Food must be taken frequently; so our spiritual growth requires frequent reception of the Eucharist. Our Eucharistic meal is, above all, our greatest way of being united to one another in the Church. The more we eat together with our family and friends, the more we get to know and understand each other, the stronger our love should grow. The more we put into celebrating the Mass and partaking of the Eucharist, the more we will receive from it. Christ is present in the priest and in the people, as we read and listen, preach and sing, and as we offer this great prayer of thanksgiving. The better we try to do these things, the more consciously we join ourselves to Him, the more we will receive from our union with Christ in Holy Communion. The Eucharist is the most intimate, personal, and meaningful union with Christ possible, if we prepare for it and give ourselves to Him. He gives us Himself totally. The rest is up to us.

As most of you have heard, we have been assigned a new pastor, Fr. Stephen Nesrsta. He has been a priest for 18 years, and is currently the pastor of St. John the Baptist in Fayetteville and St. Mary Mission in Ellinger. His official first day here will be Monday, July 1. He will be pastor for us and for Sts. Cyril & Methodius in Granger as well. Please pray for him, his current congregations and our/Granger's congregations as he makes this transition. Please also pray for Fr. Joseph Nisari, of Granger, in his transition, as he will be the new pastor for St. Joseph's in Dime Box and Holy Family Mission in Lexington. No matter what changes may come or what will be expected of us, we must all remember that God has a master plan. We all play a role in that plan and must fulfill our duties in a respectful manner and with joy in our hearts.

Celebration of Corpus Christi without our annual procession: though, sadly, we will not be having our annual procession for Corpus Christi this year (due to the fundraiser and our pastoral situation), we must remember to celebrate this feast whole-heartedly and remember why we do so each year. As Catholics, we are bound by the resounding words of Our Lord, "Do this in memory of me." In our celebration of the Eucharist, as one of our most beloved Sacraments, we recall not only the gift that God gave us so many years ago, His Son Jesus Christ, but the overwhelming sacrifice of Jesus in dying for us so that we may live with Him and His heavenly Father for eternity.
