Dear friends in Christ.

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the unity of the Holy Spirit be with you all. This weekend we begin the Season of Advent. The Advent Season is from Sunday, November 29, through the beginning of the Vigil Mass of Christmas on December 24. The Advent Season is a time of watching and waiting for the Birth of the Lord. It is a time of preparation. How are you going to prepare yourself during this time of Advent? **Our Advent Penance Service will be on Sunday, December 13.** Be sure to plan to make a good confession before you celebrate the Birth of the Lord at Christmas. The Christmas Season begins on the evening of December 24 and continues until Sunday, January 10, when we will celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. So, after Christmas Day on December 25, please do not say that Christmas is over, because, it has actually just begun. Too many Catholics and other Christians have given into the secular celebration of Christmas, a celebration that is completely absent of the presence of Jesus Christ, whose birthday we celebrate. Celebrate Advent as a time of preparation, make a good confession and spend extra time in prayer with your family.

During the Season of Advent, we usually begin decorating our homes for Christmas. I always recommend that you wait until the Third Sunday of Advent, *Gaudete Sunday*, before you turn on your Christmas lights. Also, I encourage you to leave your tree and decorations up and your Christmas lights shining until the end of the Christmas Season on January 10. Let us truly celebrate Christmas during the entire Christmas Season. I also encourage parish organizations to have their Christmas parties during the Christmas Season and not during Advent. In the USA Santa Claus has only become an advertising gimmick. Instead of Santa coming to our parties, we should live the truth of our faith and have St. Nicholas, Bishop of Myra, come to our celebrations. His feast day is next Sunday, December 6. He is the one who brought gifts to the poor and needy of his day. Our faith is filled with wonderful traditions that have been handed down to us during the past 2000 years. The more we present our faith in the spirit and truth it is meant to teach, the more people will have a conversion of heart and think about the faith they have received. Try to celebrate the feast of St. Nicholas in your home. You may want to exchange a small gift on that day or maybe put a stocking up the night before and put a gift in it for your children before morning. You could put fruit in it and maybe a gold coin. Think of various ways you can celebrate this feast day. You can find a lot of ideas on the internet also. I know that you may be getting tired of my repeating this every year, but I feel that this is something that needs to be said and needs to be thought about.

In today's Gospel Jesus says: "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come." Jesus is telling us that we must always be prepared for His Second Coming into the world and also for the day when we will leave this earth by our bodily death to stand before Him in judgment. As we all know, either one of these two events can happen at any second, any hour or any day. Are you ready? Are you watchful? Are you alert? Our Opening Prayer, the Collect, for this Mass says: "Grant your faithful, we pray, almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming, so that, gathered at his right hand, they may be worthy to possess the heavenly Kingdom." We all need a greater resolve to run forth to meet Jesus. We all need a greater resolve to be faithful to Him and to all His teachings. Many things in this world distract us from the Truths Jesus proclaimed. May we have the courage to accept His Truth and try to live it day-by-day. To be watchful and ready, and, to avoid the dangers of our distractions, we must pray daily, from our hearts, seeking a closer relationship with our Lord. Only then will we be ready to meet Him when he comes again.

Please check this bulletin for the **Penance Services** that have been scheduled at various parishes in our deanery. Try to attend with your family together to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation sometime during the Advent Season.

K úvaze: "Kdy přijdeš?" Tato otázka není převzata ze spisu nějakého mystika, ale z našich běžných hovorů. "Kdy se ukážeš? Kdy se uvidíme?" Jsou to otázky, které prozrazují touhu, očekávání. Někdy je to touha "zištná" (očekáváme od druhého nějakou službu), jindy je však zcela "nezištná": určitého člověka chceme vidět, protože ho máme rádi. A pokud je to člověk vzácný, nám velmi blízký, pak se tato touha může proměnit v nedočkavost.

"Kdy přijdeš?" Otázka tak běžná v našich každodenních rozhovorech, možná méně běžná v našich rozhovorech s Kristem. Bývalo však tomu jinak. První křesťané uchovávali živou touhu po Kristově příchodu, proto volali "Maranatha", "Přijď, Pane Ježíši".

"Kdy přijdeš?" Takovou otázkou prostoupenou hlubokou touhou (a ne strachem či lhostejností) dokážu vyslovit jen v rozhovoru s přítelem. A pokud v těchto dnech objevím přátelskou tvář Krista, tak stejná otázka se vynoří i v mém nitru. A nejen otázka, ale i touha. A nejen touha, ale i radostné těšení se na setkání s Ním. Radostné těšení sobotního večera, večera před nedělí vzkříšení, večera před nedělí Setkání. (Pastorace.cz)
