Dear friends in Christ,

Merry Christmas! I would like to thank all of you for the cards, gifts and tasty treats that I received from you for Christmas. You are truly a very generous and loving people. I pray that you may all have a blessed New Year, one that is filled with good health, holiness and joy. I would also like to thank those who decorated the church, sang in the choir, played the organ and helped out in any way to make our Christmas Masses so beautiful. Thank you for your commitment and dedication to your parish and to our Lord.

Today we have this feast of the Holy Family. On the one hand it points us to Joseph, Mary and Jesus, a family who took their faith and their faith practices very seriously. They were very devout in their religious practices. This family challenges us to look at our own family practices and ask ourselves how well we are fulfilling the requirements of our own religious law. How well does our family relate to the Holy Family of Joseph, Mary and Jesus? Is our family a holy family?

Today's feast also points us to a larger family, and that is our parish family of faith and our family of the Church throughout the world united in Jesus Christ. Our Church family is our spiritual family who stand with us to remind us of who we are and what that means in living out this life of faith. Both of these Holy Families are of great importance to us not just at Christmas, but all throughout the year as we eat together, play together, celebrate together, worship together, and grieve together as well. In both of these families there is one element which should shine out for the world to see, and that is the love of each member of the family for each of the others. The love of Jesus is the heart of a Holy Family.

In today's world, families are very different than they were even thirty years ago. Today, many families are supported by single mothers or fathers. In those with two parents, children are often not the offspring of both. Today, in our society, both mothers and fathers commonly work outside the home, sharing the breadwinning and nurturing functions. Also, many times the children are being raised by someone other than their parents, such as their grandparents or their aunt and uncle. Whatever the make-up of the family, its function remains the same. It exists primarily for the support and affection each member provides for the others. Parents have special responsibilities to protect and educate their children. Children have the obligation to love, obey, and--to the extent possible--be supportive of their parents. These are the natural moral duties we have as family members, especially in a family with the Christian spirit of love.

The first two readings today emphasize these family duties. Sirach describes how children should honor their parents. St. Paul tells us that it is love which binds all of our virtues together and makes them perfect. How well are we at loving our family members? Do we love purely or are there all kinds of conditions to our love?

In today's gospel Simeon recognized the love of God which Jesus was to bring into the world. However, he also recognized the great sorrow which Jesus would bring to His mother. Sorrow is part of loving. Sorrow is part of family life. Sometimes, as in the Holy Family, this sorrow arises from events the family cannot control. The only thing family members can do is offer their support. In Christian families, if difficulties or sorrows arise, the extended family in the Church is there to offer assistance.

As members of the Body of Christ we are all united by the spirit of His love. Through Jesus' incarnation, which we celebrate at Christmas, and through His death and resurrection, we have become part of His Holy Family. If we love each other, as he has commanded us to do, we will provide the affection and support family members owe one another. Even as we follow the example of Jesus, Mary and Joseph in filling our immediate families with the spirit of love we can give meaning to our Christian faith by extending that love to others. Let us work together to do what we can to make all of our families a holy family centered on the love of Jesus Christ, both our families at home and our Church family.

This week, beginning Thursday evening, December 31, and Friday, January 1, we celebrate the solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. Let us join together to honor our Blessed Mother, to thank her for being the mother of God, Jesus, and to ask her to be praying for us. See this bulletin for the Mass schedule.

Are your Christmas lights still shining? The Christmas Season continues until Sunday, January 10, 2021. Keep those lights on until the end of the Christmas Season to give witness to the true Light of the world, Jesus Christ.

MYŠLENKY: Co můžeme vidět na nazaretské rodině? Jistě ne jen to, co nám říkají legendy: jak svatý Josef jen mlčel, Panna Maria líbezně všechno vedla a Ježíšek poslouchal, i když to tak samozřejmě mohlo být. Naše vidění má jít hlouběji: uprostřed této rodiny byl Bůh, přítomný plně, skutečně v Ježíši. Bůh, který velmi pronikavým způsobem zasáhl do života Josefa i Marie, Bůh, kterého Ježíš nazývá Otcem. A tahle věc není vázána na dobu, ve které člověk žije. Stojíme tedy před otázkou: co stojí ve středu zájmu mé rodiny? Co je centrem, okolo kterého se má vše točit a řídit? Spokojenost bručavého manžela nebo náladové manželky? Dům, byt, zahrada, domácí pořádek? Nebo ušlechtileji - děti?

To všechno jsou věci, které jistě do života patří a vyžadují dost velkou míru našeho zájmu, ale nic z toho nemůže být centrálním bodem zájmu - ani děti ne! Co nám říká Písmo? V listě Kolosanům jsme četli: "Ať ve vašem srdci vládne Kristův pokoj, k němu jste byli povolání v jednom těle. Buďte za to vděční." Co je to ten Kristův pokoj? Je to pohoda svátečního odpoledne, kdy není žádná práce, zrovna není doma žádný konflikt, nikdo nepřichází na návštěvu, malé děti spí... ale nevydrží to déle než hodinu? Toto jistě ne. Protože pokoj, který přináší Kristus, je jiný pokoj, než který přináší svět. Kristův pokoj je pokoj, který vychází z překonání zla. Z překonání zla vykoupením. Jinak řečeno: je to pokoj, vyrůstající ze smíření. Ne ze smíření se s osudem, bolestí, životem. Je to pokoj, který vyrůstá ze smíření s Bohem. A k tomu nutně patří i smíření s lidmi a se sebou samým. Kristův pokoj tedy znamená, že člověk sám osobně prožije Boží dobrotu: že prožije odpuštění a sjednocení - s Bohem i s lidmi. To jedno tělo, do kterého nás Kristův pokoj sjednocuje, je společenstvím lidí, kteří chtějí mít Boha ve svém středu. (Pastorace.cz)
