Dear friends in Christ,

This weekend the Season of Christmas comes to an end as we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Our Christmas lights and decorations will be taken down and stored away for another year. Tomorrow the Season of Ordinary Time begins and will continue until the beginning of Lent on February 17. During Ordinary Time we reflect on the daily life and ministry of Jesus Christ. As we all know, His life and ministry was not so ordinary. Therefore, our life and ministry should not be so ordinary either. Jesus calls us, by virtue of our baptism, to live a radical life of faithfulness to Him and to His Church. In today's day and time this means that we are to be and act much differently than most other people in the world.

Just think about the past Seasons of Advent and Christmas. How difficult was it to wait to turn on your Christmas lights until the third or fourth week of Advent or until Christmas Eve? How difficult was it for you to keep your lights on until today? Did you think to yourself, "What will the neighbors think of me?" Most people hesitate when it comes to being different than everyone else around them. However, if we surround ourselves with people who live the faith faithfully, then it is not so difficult to be different than most people in the world because we have people around us who support us and we in turn support them. This is one reason that Jesus gave us the Church, to be a means of supporting one another in living the faith. If we stray from the Church, from THE Truth, then we will not be living the faith according to what Jesus intended. We need to be faithful to our own baptismal profession. So, surround yourself with people who are truly trying to be faithful and you will also be faithful. This is very important when you are seeking someone to marry and to spend your entire life with. Part of the marriage commitment is support to John by allowing Himself to be baptized by John, let us support one another in living our faith in this Ordinary Time. By doing so, our lives will not seem so ordinary and will be full of the Spirit which leads us in not so ordinary ways.

To bylo slavnostní uvedení v úřad, nastolení Božího služebníka do veřejné služby. Začalo to pro nás dost nepochopitelně - Ježíš se zařadil do zástupu hříšníků, kteří přicházeli k Janu Křtiteli, vyznávali své hříchy a dávali se na znamení pokání ponořovat (pokřtít) do vod Jordánu. Ježíš, ač je bez hříchu, začíná svou veřejnou činnost tím, že se mezi hříšníky staví. A potom následují podivuhodné věci, které evangelista označuje slovy: otevřené, doslova protržené, nebe, Duch snášející se jako holubice, hlas o milovaném Synu. Slavnostnější intronizaci si nelze představit, zvlášť když čteme tyto řádky očima židovských současníků. Protržené nebe, to byl sen proroků, je to okamžik, kdy se otvírá proud Božího daru lidem, zemi, celému stvoření. Ten, kdo je pomazaný Duchem, má nejvyšší poslání a pověření, jedná v samotné síle Boží, je to Mesiáš, jedinečný pomazaný Páně. Je to milovaný Syn, ztělesnění věrnosti a Bohu milosti v celém Izrael.
