Dear friends in Christ,

This weekend, we celebrate **Called by Name Sunday** which is part of the **Diocese of Austin Year of the Domestic Church**. Please take time to think of people from our parish who you think have the gifts needed to be a priest or a religious brother or sister. You may want to encourage them personally to think about the priesthood or religious life. Let them know that you see something within them, and that God may be calling them to one of these vocations. Please join us for a **Holy Hour of Prayer for vocations this Sunday, January 17, at 3:00 pm**. Let us pray for men and women to respond to God's calling them to a religious vocation.

In today's Gospel, we hear John calling Jesus "the Lamb of God." Jesus is the Lamb that would be sacrificed for the sins of all people, taking the place of the sacrificial lambs that were offered in the Temple. We make this same declaration at every Mass as we say, "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world" and as the priest says, "This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world" as he holds the Host and shows it to the people before receiving Holy Communion. The Host is that same Lamb of God, Jesus Himself, who continues to take away our sins. Let us recognize Him as we receive Him.

Also, in today's Gospel we hear the calling of Andrew and Simon to be two of the apostles of Jesus and in the first reading we hear the calling of Samuel by God for his mission in life. We are also called, each of us by name, to be of service to God. Some are called to marriage, some to the priesthood, some to religious life and others are called to remain single and to serve God in a special way in their life. Do we see our vocation as a calling? Do we see our vocation as the way we have been called to be of service to God? Every vocation is a holy calling, so we must try to keep ourselves holy by living a life of purity in each of our vocations and by always listening to God and being in communication with Him. Let us all take time to reflect upon the way we have been called as individuals for our mission in life.

Prayer for the Diocese of Austin Year of the Domestic Church

O God, creator of all, you ordered the earth to bring forth life and crowned its goodness by creating the human family. In history's moment when all was ready, you sent your Son to dwell in time, "practicing the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity." Teach us the sanctity of human love; show us the value of the Domestic Church; and help us to live in peace with all people, that we may share in your life forever. With the intercession of St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church, we ask this through Christ the Lord. Amen.

"Called by Name" Sunday: We often ask our young women and men what they would like to be when they grow up. If a religious sister or priest is mentioned, are we ready to support them? If there is someone you know in our parish who should be encouraged to consider these vocations, we want to know. Envelopes on the bulletin tables are available to submit their names. The Diocese of Austin Vocations Office will contact them to provide resources and information as they consider a vocation. "Come and follow me," said Jesus to Simon Peter and Andrew. Ultimately, each person is called by name by God. We might need to help them see the gifts and talents they have.

Prayer to St. Joseph after the Rosary

This prayer to Saint Joseph—spouse of the Virgin Mary, foster father of Jesus, and patron saint of the universal Church—was composed by Pope Leo XIII in his 1889 encyclical, *Quamquam pluries*. He asked that it be added to the end of the Rosary, especially during the month of October, which is dedicated to the Rosary. It may be said after the customary *Salve Regina* and concluding prayer and may also be used to conclude other Marian devotions.

During the Year of Saint Joseph, the prayer is ordinarily enriched with a partial indulgence (*Handbook of Indulgences*, conc. 19). During the Year of Saint Joseph, however—which lasts from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021—the use of this prayer has been included among those enriched with a plenary indulgence (see Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary issued Dec. 8, 2020, section E). It may be said on any day of the Year of Saint Joseph, but especially on his various feast days or other devotional days dedicated to St. Joseph:

- December 27, 2020, the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph
- March 19, 2021, the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary
- May 1, 2021, the Optional Memorial of Saint Joseph the Worker the nineteenth day of each month
- Every Wednesday, the traditional day of the week for devotions to Saint Joseph
- "St. Joseph Sunday" and suitable days of other liturgical rites in the Eastern Catholic Churches

Prayer to Saint Joseph

To you, O blessed Joseph, do we come in our tribulation, and having implored the help of your most holy Spouse, we confidently invoke your patronage also.

Through that charity which bound you to the Immaculate Virgin Mother of God and through the paternal love with which you embraced the Child Jesus, we humbly beg you graciously to regard the inheritance which Jesus Christ has purchased by his Blood, and with your power and strength to aid us in our necessities.

O most watchful guardian of the Holy Family, defend the chosen children of Jesus Christ; O most loving father, ward off from us every contagion of error and corrupting influence; O our most mighty protector, be kind to us and from heaven assist us in our struggle with the power of darkness.

As once you rescued the Child Jesus from deadly peril, so now protect God's Holy Church from the snares of the enemy and from all adversity; shield, too, each one of us by your constant protection, so that, supported by your example and your aid, we may be able to live piously, to die in holiness, and to obtain eternal happiness in heaven.

Amen.
