

Fast and Abstinence During Lent: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence and Fridays are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully, and to celebrate more readily, His Resurrection.

During the Lenten season, help to support missionary efforts in and outside of the Diocese of Austin by participating in the **Ashes to Easter** program. Pick up a box from the bulletin tables and place it in a prominent place in your home where you will remember to pray daily for the missions and drop in your spare change. You will then return your boxes at Easter. Thank you, in advance, for your participation and generosity.

Dear friends in Christ.

Peace be with you. Well, what an unusual winter this has been. We are reminded how thankful we should be to have electricity and running water. We should never take the comforts of life for granted but should give thanks to God for them. Without these comforts, life is difficult. Let us see how blessed we really are.

This past Wednesday we began this Holy Season of Lent. As we live the Season of Lent, we may want to see how this holy season can strengthen our family life. Think of ways in which you can celebrate this season as a family...i.e., pray together at home as a family, attend Mass on the weekend, and when possible, during the week as a family, attend Stations of the Cross as a family, read the Bible together as a family, go to confession together as a family, read the daily readings and reflect on them together as a family. I am sure there are many things you can do as a family to make this season more meaningful to you. Going to Stations of the Cross should be one of the most important spiritual exercises that you do during this Season of Lent. We are having Stations of the Cross on Wednesdays, as usual, with all the Religious Education Students to help them to appreciate the importance of this devotion. I would like to invite all the parents to be present for the Stations of the Cross to support your children and to support one another in this Lenten Season.

Today's first reading from Genesis speaks of a new beginning, a new covenant that God made with Noah and his sons after the disastrous flood. The first covenant had been shattered by human sinfulness. God was grieved by the sinfulness of the people and the flood was seen as His divine reaction. But there was a note of hope in all this because Noah found favor with God. It is God who comes to Noah and his family and forms a new covenant with them and their descendants. God is saying to Noah and to us, "let us forget the past, we will begin anew with peace between Me and all of creation." The rainbow will be the sign of this newness.

Let us also forget the past and begin anew. This is precisely what happens when we go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, when we go to confession. A new beginning is possible because God is helping us. Christ has given us all that we need to turn to Him: The Sacrament of Reconciliation to reconcile us, to forgive our sins; His Body and Blood in Holy Communion to strengthen us; the Inspired Word of God in the Bible to motivate us; His Church to direct and support us; and most of all His love, strength and mercy as shown to us by the Crucifix. God seeks us out to help us have a new beginning.

The Gospel today tells us of Jesus' forty days in the desert. This forty-day period of Christ, fasting and praying in the desert, is the origin of our forty-day Lenten season. The Gospel today also mentions Christ's appearance in Galilee and the beginning of His preaching. This too, was a new beginning for the people. "The kingdom of God is at hand! Repent, and believe in the gospel." Let us repent and reform our lives and make a new beginning this Lent. Put the past behind us and begin anew. That is what Lent is all about.

Bůh mnohokrát v dějinách přetrpěl lidské odmítnutí. Nyní přichází Kristus, který svojí poslušností zahladí propast mezi člověkem a Bohem. Nás zve, abychom Boha přijali a neodmítli.

Praying together as a family also strengthens the relationships within the family and allows the family to grown in faith together. Does your family pray together? What is one simple way that you can increase the prayer time with your family or those living in your household?
