Fast and Abstinence During Lent: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence and Fridays are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully, and to celebrate more readily, His Resurrection.

During the Lenten season, help to support missionary efforts in and outside of the Diocese of Austin by participating in the **Ashes to Easter** program. Pick up a box from the bulletin tables and place it in a prominent place in your home where you will remember to pray daily for the missions and drop in your spare change. You will then return your boxes at Easter. Thank you, in advance, for your participation and generosity.

Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace, love, hope, joy and forgiveness of God be with each of you. How is your Lenten observance going? Did you attend Stations of the Cross this past Wednesday? Make the most of this season and grow in your life of faith by spending more time in prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Come to the Stations of the Cross every Wednesday and walk with Jesus on His journey to Calvary. Take a day each week to fast from food or from something else that would help you to be a better Christian. Pick up a Lent Box to put your spare coins in as part of your almsgiving. Put some effort into this season and you will be blessed in many ways.

In today's Gospel we hear about the transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain. With Him are Peter, James and John. They experience Jesus in His heavenly state of being. Moses and Elijah appear on the mountain with Jesus -- Moses representing the Law and giving his approval to Jesus by his presence there and Elijah, representing the prophets and thus giving his approval to Jesus by his presence. What a wonderful experience this must have been for the three apostles. To hear the voice of God say "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him." Wow! Every time we gather for Mass we are on the mountain with Jesus. We listen to His words. We have a very personal encounter with Him as His Body and Blood become present to us in the Eucharist and then we receive Jesus in Holy Communion. It is a very intimate and personal moment. Do we realize what is happening? Or, are we rather confused like the apostles were on the mountain not knowing what to say? All of us are called to be with Jesus and to experience His majesty and His love. Do we? Is there something keeping us from experiencing what He wants us to experience during the celebration of Holy Mass? It is really a test of faith. In today's first reading from Genesis, we hear about Abraham and how his faith was tested as God asked him to take his only son, Isaac, up to the mountain to offer him as a holocaust, as a sacrifice. Abraham experienced the glory of God because he was willing to do what was asked of him. He let go of his pride and his own wants and desires. We must do the same if we are to experience the glory of God and His love every time we go to Mass and when we go to pray. May God's grace be with you so that you have such an experience.

K úvaze: Dnešní evangelium druhé postní neděle nás vybízí, abychom rozjímali o proměnění Páně (srov. Mk 9,2-10). Ježíš vzal s sebou tři učedníky – Petra, Jakuba a Jana – a »vyvedl je na vysokou horu« (Mk 9,2) a tam se jim na chvíli zjeví ve svojí slávě, slávě Syna Božího. Událost proměnění tak umožňuje učedníkům pozitivně se vyrovnat s Ježíšovým umučením a nebýt zdrceni. Uviděli ho, jaký bude po umučení, až bude oslaven. Ježíš je tak připravuje na zkoušku. Proměnění pomáhá učedníkům – i nám – chápat, že Kristovo umučení je mysteriem utrpení, ale především darem lásky, nekonečné Ježíšovy lásky.

Segundo Domingo de Cuaresma: Este domingo somos desafiados por esta pregunta: ¿Estamos dispuestos a realizar todo el viaje a través de la tentación, el sufrimiento, la muerte y la resurrección como participantes con Cristo o nos convertiremos en observadores solamente? Ser un discípulo de Jesús involucra riesgo. Puede significar que tenemos que dejar el confort, la seguridad del "hogar" para ir a un lugar nuevo que Dios escoja. Las lecturas de este domingo nos piden darnos cuenta de que el viaje Cristiano tiene riesgos, sufrimiento y muerte, pero termina con la gloria para aquellos que caminan con Cristo ¿Está usted dispuesto a correr ese riesgo? May all of you have a blessed Lenten week.
