The **Confraternity of Christian Mothers** will meet this Sunday, March 21, in the RE Bldg. immediately following the 8:30 a.m. Mass. (**Members, note date change from usual 4th Sunday due to Palm Sunday service.**) All ladies of the parish are invited to attend.

Fast and Abstinence During Lent: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence and Fridays are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully, and to celebrate more readily, His Resurrection.

During the Lenten season, help to support missionary efforts in and outside of the Diocese of Austin by participating in the **Ashes to Easter** program. If all the boxes were taken and you did not get you, you could make your own box or put your donation in an envelope marked "Ashes to Easter". You will then return your boxes at Easter. Thank you, in advance, for your participation and generosity.

Dear Parishioners,

May the peace and love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. We congratulate those of our parish who are receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this weekend at the 10:30 am Mass. May the Holy Spirit set them on fire with the love of God and may they faithfully serve Him all the days of their life. For the next two weeks our statues will be covered to remind us that we are in the most solemn time of our Church year. The covering of the statues reminds us that we are to give up all that is pleasing to our senses during this remaining time of Lent and focus upon the suffering of our Lord. Let us enter into these final days of Lent with our entire our entire being, mind, body and soul, so that we can even more intensely experience the joy of the resurrection and salvation.

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. **The Easter Triduum during Holy Week is our most sacred and solemn time of the whole year. We should make it a priority to attend the celebrations on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday, setting aside other non-religious activities that may conflict with these sacred days. Let us be faithful to God. Our schedule for the Easter Triduum will be as follows:**

**Holy Thursday - 7:00 p.m., Good Friday - 7:00 p.m., Holy Saturday - 8:30 p.m.
Easter Sunday - 6:30 a.m., 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.**

We will be having Altar Server practice for each of the above celebrations. Altar Servers will have practice for Holy Thursday on Palm Sunday, March 28, following the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Altar Server practice for Good Friday will be after Mass on Holy Thursday. Altar Server practice for Holy Saturday will be at 11:00 a.m. on Holy Saturday. All Altar Servers who are scheduled to serve at each of the above celebrations are asked to be at these practices. If you are not able to serve when scheduled, please find a substitute for you and be sure to tell them that they must attend the practice as scheduled for that particular day. Also please let me know so that I will know who will be serving. Thank you to all of you for serving at God's Altar.

Today's Gospel focuses on the nearness of Jesus' "hour". His "hour" refers to His suffering, death and resurrection. It is not a literal hour, but a period of time that we now call the Sacred Paschal Triduum. In this Gospel passage Jesus is preparing His apostles and others around Him for the upcoming events. Once again they hear a voice from heaven. Just as they heard this voice at Jesus' baptism and at His transfiguration on the mountain, they hear our Heavenly Father assuring them that He is with His Son. Do we recognize God's presence with us in times of difficulty? Do we seek His presence with us?

Katechismus katolické církve reprodukuje myšlenku svatého Františka z Asissi: „A nebyli to ani zlí duchové, kteří ho ukřižovali; byls to ty s nimi, který jsi ho ukřižoval a ještě ho přibíjíš na kříž, když si libuješ v neřestech a hříších“ (KKC 598). V hříších a neřestech si libujeme tehdy, pokud je s plným vědomím nechceme rozpoznávat, přiznat si je, vyznat je ve svátosti smíření.

Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma: El Evangelio este domingo nos señala hacia el amor que se auto sacrifica de Jesús. Ninguna fruta puede crecer sin que la semilla renuncie a su vida a favor de la planta. Las doctrinas Sociales de la Iglesia son difíciles para muchos por que retan muchas creencias enraizadas. Nuestra enseñanza sobre la vida abarca a los no-natos y las personas sentenciadas a muerte; nuestra enseñanza sobre solidaridad nos pide que no sólo nos preguntemos sobre nuestra propia mejora, sino nos preguntemos si los más pobres del mundo están también mejorando; nuestra enseñanza sobre el medio ambiente nos llama a examinar qué tan grande es nuestra huella de carbono. Esta es la temporada de conversión y sacrificio, en las últimas semanas de la Cuaresma ¿qué actitud o hábito está Dios pidiéndole a usted que evalúe a la luz de la Doctrina Social de la Iglesia?

As we enter these most sacred days, I pray that all of you may be renewed in spirit and in faith as we celebrate the mystery of our salvation.

How to practice Almsgiving as a Family

- Give up buying junk food and contribute that money to the jar or box.
- If you have young children who cannot contribute money, let them contribute by decorating the jar or box.
- Hold a yard sale and contribute the proceeds to the collection.
- Invite friends to join your family in contributing to the charity
