

Training Series for Initiation (RCIA) Ministers and Catechetical Leaders: The Diocese of Austin Office of Evangelization and Catechesis is beginning a ten-session course that focuses on the RCIA vision, periods, and rites. Dear friends in Christ.

Peace be with you! Please pray for those who will receive the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Jesus for the first time in Holy Communion next Sunday. May they always have a desire to receive Him often.

Thank you to everyone who are making monthly donations to the Building Fund. We need to build up this fund so that we can begin our building projects here at Holy Trinity. The construction company is in the process of redesigning the new restrooms and the porte-cochere. The first design was out of our budget. Hopefully I will have more information on the progress of Phase I & II of our long range project soon. The facilities manager of the Diocese of Austin is working with the construction company and with our long range committee to come up with the best possible design that is still within our budget.

In today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles we continue to hear how Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, performed the same works as Jesus. Peter attributed all he was doing to the name of Jesus Christ. Peter doesn't say that he himself is the person who does these miracles things, but, that it is only Jesus who does it all through him. A good disciple of Jesus always gives Jesus the credit for what he is doing. A good disciple never brags about his own accomplishments but says that all was accomplished only because God's hand was at work in what he was doing. This is why it is so important to allow Jesus to be your shepherd in your life.

In today's gospel we hear about Christ the Good Shepherd. Jesus wants to be your Shepherd. He wants to lead you to green pastures and to the waters of life. He wants to take care of you. He wants you to listen to His voice and for you to follow Him. He has given His life for you. This is all very comforting. It is important that we also realize that the Good Shepherd needs to correct us from time to time so that we stay away from sin and so that we can live a good and moral life. Most people say that they have Christ as their Shepherd, but when it comes to receiving correction from the Shepherd they do not listen to Him. We must allow Christ to be our Shepherd from beginning to end, not only choosing Him as our Shepherd when it is convenient for us. Is Jesus really your Shepherd? May God's blessings be upon all of you as you try to listen to the voice of Jesus so that He may lead and guide you. Take time throughout the day to stop and listen in silence to Jesus. You will be amazed at what He has to say to you.
