Dear friends in Christ,

Here we are on this Fifth Sunday of Easter. We congratulate those who are receiving the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Jesus Christ for the first time in Holy Communion this weekend. May they always have a burning desire within them to receive our Lord every week and may they truly become what they receive so that they will be His living presence in the world.

Many college students are preparing for final exams. It can be a nerve-wrecking time. We must always remind ourselves that Jesus gave us new life in His resurrection. We need to live in that new life, which means living in Him. May His resurrected life give you peace and comfort knowing that He is with you.

The month of May has begun and during this month we give honor to our Blessed Mother, Mary. Don't forget to pray the rosary daily reflecting upon the mysteries for each day. In doing so we grow closer to her Son, Jesus, and we grow stronger in our faith.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us that He is the vine and we are the branches. His Father will cut off from the vine those branches that do not bear fruit. So, we need to be sure we are bearing good fruit, bringing the love and forgiveness of God to everyone we meet. We can only do this if we are connected to the vine. How do we stay connected? St. John tells us in the second reading that we do this by keeping His commandments. If we do not keep the commandments, we wither and dry up. Many who consider themselves to be good Christians are not keeping the commandments and they believe that this is ok. Well, it is not. They are withering and drying up and don't even realize it. Then they wonder why they are not happy or why they seem to be miserable all the time. Jesus is very clear in the gospels that only those who keep the commandments will inherit eternal life in heaven. Only by keeping the commandments can we live in the love and joy that God has to offer to us.

In history's moment when all was ready, you sent your Son to dwell in time, "practicing the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity." Teach us the sanctity of human love; show us the value of the Domestic Church; and help us to live in peace with all people, that we may share in your life forever. With the intercession of St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church, we ask this through Christ the Lord. Amen.

For the month of May, we continue our reflections for the Year of the Domestic Church by celebrating the gift of parenthood. We thank the Lord for the countless sacrifices that parents make, from sleepless nights to working long hours to provide for their families. Their roles are often thankless, but vital to our domestic churches. In their openness to new life, parents are cooperators with the Lord in creation and entrusted by God with the lives of their children. Christ himself taught us to approach God as a parent. Throughout the Gospels, Jesus gives us the term "Abba," meaning father. The use of this word indicates a level of intimacy and conjures-up ideas of the tenderness between a parent and child. The term also indicates a level of authority. The faithful are called to obedience in their relationship with God, as a child is called to obedience in relationship with his or her parent.
