

#### Dear friends in Christ.

May the hope, faith and love of the Risen Jesus be with each of you. Happy and Blessed Mother's Day to all faithful mothers on this special day! May all mothers have a day filled with much love and joy in a very special way today. Thank you for the many sacrifices that you make each day so that we, your children, can live a better life. Thank you for your love and for your faithfulness to what God has called you to be, a mother to your children. Thank you for being there to give us comfort and thank you for your words of support and encouragement. We love you!

This Thursday is the feast of Our Lady of Fatima. I encourage you to know that story of Mary's apparition to the children in Fatima, Portugal some 114 years ago. We will pray the rosary at 3:00 pm in the church followed by the celebration of the Anointing of the Sick. Come and join us as we honor Mary and pray for all who are ill.

Recently I have been asked several times whether it is o.k. for a Catholic to attend the wedding of a Catholic in the church of another denomination or in a garden or hall or other non-sacred place. Even though I have printed this in the bulletin several times, it seems it is necessary to print it again. First of all, all Catholics are obligated to be married in a Catholic church. If they do not, then they are committing a serious sin and can no longer receive Holy Communion. If the Catholic is marrying a non-Catholic and the couple wants to get married in a church of another religious denomination, the couple may ask for permission from the bishop who will normally grant such permission. For Catholics, the Sacraments are celebrated in the church. Permission is not usually given to have a wedding in a garden, hall or any other non-sacred place. Catholics may attend weddings of two non-Catholics, i.e. anyone who was not baptized in the Catholic Church, wherever the wedding takes place because non-Catholics are not under the obligation of Catholic Law. So, if you are invited to a wedding of a Catholic to a non-Catholic that is being held in a church other than a Catholic church, and you are unsure about whether it is o.k. to attend or not, ask the couple getting married or ask their parents, whether they have received permission from the bishop to have their wedding in that church. If not, then you should not attend because the Catholic who is getting married in the non-Catholic church or in a garden or hall, etc., is committing sin, and you do not want to support or participate in their act of sin. Faithfulness to Jesus is more important than the keeping of our human relationships.

In today's readings we hear much about love. Jesus tells us that we are to keep His commandment and the main commandment is love. What is love? Love is more than a feeling. Love is more than an emotion. Love is a choice we make to give of ourselves unselfishly to and for the good of another, just as Jesus did on the cross. Sometimes I hear people say, "I don't feel like I love that person anymore." Only when we live by feelings and emotions can we make such a statement. True love loves the other person no matter what happens and no matter how they feel. It is a choice we make. True love always tells the truth. True love always is honest. True love says what needs to be said in the spirit of charity even though it may mean that the person that it is said to may not speak to us again. True love does not talk down to other people. True love speaks with humility. True loves desires the other person to go to heaven. This means supporting the other person in living a life of faithfulness to Jesus and to His Church. This means not being afraid to tell the other person when they are straying away from Jesus and His Church and gently leading them to do what is right, even though doing what is right may be inconvenient or difficult. In order to do this, we must overcome our own feelings and emotions as Jesus did. This can be very difficult when we are insecure or when we are a very "needy" people. But, with the help of the Holy Spirit, we can do it. We just need to have faith and trust in our Lord.

Tak ani život křesťana nepromění stálé apelování na to, jaký má být, ale spíš jeho vlastní dotek s Boží láskou, zážitky odpuštění a milosti. Člověk musí nejdřív poznat a pochopit, že je milován, že je obdarován, že je mu odpuštěno, a teprve potom se "dá do pohybu". Kdyby pouhé lidské milování "na výzvu" mohlo všechno spravit, pak by byla zřejmě Ježíšova oběť zbytečná.

A konečně - i když mají lidé "poznat z lásky křesťanů lásku Boží", nikdy nesmíme zapomenout, že naše sebevětší láska lásku Boží nenahradí. Dotyk člověka s Boží láskou je nezastupitelný! (Pastorace.cz)
