

Dear friends in Christ,

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. We read in the Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11 of how Jesus appeared to the Apostles for a period of forty days. Forty is a number often used in the Bible to express a time a preparation and completion. So, when the Apostles were fully prepared to continue on the ministry of Jesus, Jesus was ascended to Heaven and then ten days later sent the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the others who were gathered with them in the upper room. The account of the Ascension is also found in the Gospel of Mark, as we heard in today's readings. The Ascension is also mentioned in the Gospel of Luke. Jesus ascended into Heaven so that the Holy Spirit, also called the Advocate and Paraclete, would be sent to guide and lead the Apostles in spreading the Good News and in forming the Church. As we prepare to celebrate Pentecost next Sunday, I would encourage you to say the Prayer to the Holy Spirit each day this week.



Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful and enkindle in them the fire of Thy love.

Send forth Thy Spirit and they shall be created.

And Thou shalt renew the face of the earth.

O God, Who by the light of the Holy Spirit, didst instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant us in the same Spirit to be truly wise and ever to rejoice in His consolation.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen



The liturgical color for Pentecost Sunday is red. I encourage you to wear something red next Sunday as a reminder to all that we are celebrating the great Feast of Pentecost.

Oftentimes questions arise about marriage and what is appropriate for Catholics. First of all, all Catholics are obligated to be married in a Catholic church. If they do not, then they are committing a serious sin and can no longer receive Holy Communion. If the Catholic is marrying a non-Catholic and the couple wants to get married in a church of another religious denomination, the couple may ask for permission from the bishop who will normally grant such permission. For Catholics, the Sacraments are celebrated in the church. Permission is not usually given to have a wedding in a garden, hall or any other non-sacred place. Catholics may attend weddings of two non-Catholics, i.e. anyone who was not baptized in the Catholic Church, wherever the wedding takes place because they do not consider marriage to be a Sacrament and non-Catholics are not under the obligation of Catholic Law. So, if you are invited to a wedding of a Catholic to a non-Catholic that is being held in a church other than a Catholic church, and you are unsure about whether it is o.k. to attend or not, ask the couple getting married or ask their parents, whether they have received permission from the bishop to have their wedding in that church. If not, then you should not attend because the Catholic who is getting married in the non-Catholic church or in a garden or hall, etc., is committing sin, and you do not want to support or participate in their act of sin. Faithfulness to Jesus is more important than the keeping of our human relationships.
