#### Dear friends in Christ,

Happy Feast Day! Today is the Feast Day of our Parish, Holy Trinity. It is a day to celebrate! "O most Holy Trinity, Undivided unity, Holy God, mighty God, God immortal be adored!" This is the refrain of one the hymns in honor of the Holy Trinity, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. One God, Three Divine Persons. A mystery of our faith. This mystery was revealed to us by Jesus as He said "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit..." as we heard in today's Gospel according to Matthew. Jesus also spoke of Himself as the Son and how He and the Father are one. He also spoke of sending us the Holy Spirit, which we celebrated last Sunday on the feast of Pentecost. Our belief in the Trinity is central to our faith as Christians. It is one of the teachings that all Christians profess, even if they never mention the term in their services, and it is one of the teachings that must be professed by every denomination if they are going to call themselves Christian. We profess our belief in the Trinity every time we make the Sign of the Cross and any time a blessing is given by a priest or deacon. Also, we usually end our prayer by saying "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen." May the most holy Trinity bless us all.

Next weekend is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi. We will have a procession with the Blessed Sacrament after the 5:00 pm Mass on Saturday. Let us join together to honor the Body and Blood of our Lord present in the Eucharist, the Blessed Sacrament, by participating in this procession. To God be all glory and honor, now and forever.

Please pray for all the priests of the Diocese of Austin as they attend a meeting Tuesday thru Thursday of this week in Horseshoe Bay, west of Austin. May the Holy Spirit guide them in their discussions.

Prayer for the Diocese of Austin Year of the Domestic Church

O God, creator of all, you ordered the earth to bring forth life and crowned its goodness by creating the human family. In history's moment when all was ready, you sent your Son to dwell in time, "practicing the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity." Teach us the sanctity of human love; show us the value of the Domestic Church; and help us to live in peace with all people, that we may share in your life forever. With the intercession of St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church, we ask this through Christ the Lord. Amen.

Young people are a gift from God. The Gospel of Matthew demonstrates the special place that young people have with God. It says: "Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these (Mat. 19:13-15)." Children contribute to the good of the family. They bring love and vitality to their families, as well as grow in and share faith with their families. They also learn Christian discipleship from their parents and contribute to helping their parents grow in holiness through mutual affection, love and forgiveness (cf. CCC 2225-2229). As children grow into youth and young adulthood, they grow in faith according to their various stages in life, and are called to share in Christ's mission at each stage. In his Apostolic Exhortation Christus Vivit, Pope Francis states: "Filled with the love of Christ, young people are called to be witnesses of the Gospel wherever they find themselves, by the way they live (CV 175)." We can look to the lives of young people as examples of what it means to rely on our parents for our basic needs. As children of God, we rely on the love and mercy of our heavenly father as we grow in holiness throughout our lives. In what ways is God a father to you?
