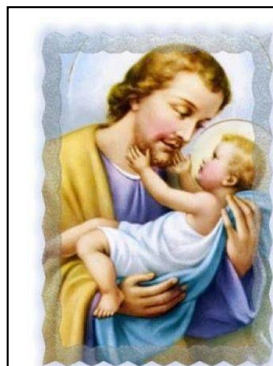

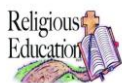

The Church & Science (Pro Life Corner 6/21) Is the Catholic Church anti-science? We often hear in the public realm that Christians are anti-science. One of the reasons for this is that some Christian churches believe things like the world was created some 10,000 years ago at the beginning of the Old Testament. Another reason is that it is beneficial to some politicians or pundits to paint Christians as anti-science in order to further a particular agenda. However, one of the many beautiful things about the Catholic Church is that we are a church of both faith and reason. Reason includes both philosophy and science, and we recognize that faith and reason are both gifts from God. Our history in the early study of the cosmos (which continues to this very day!), to our involvement in the beginnings of the health care system are just the tip of the iceberg. The Catholic Church was founded by Jesus Christ. While that is an entire discussion, for the purpose of this article, it is safe to say that Christ, who exists outside of time itself, could foresee the need for a corporate church that had authority on faith and morals (Mt 16:19) down through the ages. When it comes to pro-life this is especially important when it comes to the rapidly changing world of science. The Church's involvement and investment in science, and in bioethicists committed to following the magisterium is vital to not only informing our bishops, but also should instill confidence to the faithful as we face new technologies and cultural changes. Whether we are talking about the beginning of life, abortion, cloning, IVF, contraception, gene therapy, stem cell research, genetically modified food, gender ideology, to today's hot topic like the ethics of the various Covid vaccines, we can take comfort that the Church has considered these questions carefully in offering moral clarity to the faithful. While some of these issues are easily discernible, others are more complex. Even those with a well-formed conscience can often misunderstand the Church's position on these issues. We live in an era where confusion seems to be at an all-time high, both in the secular world as well as among various Christian denominations. As Catholics we can confidently turn to the Church for answers and clarity.

In today's gospel Jesus brings calm to the storm. The disciples tell Jesus, before He calms the storm, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" After Jesus calms the storm He asks the disciples, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" We, like the disciples, are terrified when there is a storm in our life, whether it be a storm caused by the weather, or another kind of storm, like illness, disease, physical disability, injury, divorce or other crisis. Sometimes we create our own storms in life and then blame everyone else for them. If we could live our life in complete faithfulness to Jesus and His Church we could avoid most of these storms. Many storms are caused by the decisions that we make in life because we make them not with sound judgment, but, we make too many decisions based on our feelings and emotions. Usually these decisions do not turn out very good. No matter how the storm in our life may have begun we often ask, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus always asks the Father to give us what we need to handle these storms in our life. May we always put our faith and trust in Him, know that He is with us. By putting it all in His hands we can live through these storms in calm and in peace even though our feelings and emotions may try to tear us apart. Ask our Lord to help you have the peace and calm you are seeking.

K úvaze: Dnes je módní vyzkoušet své schopnosti a odolnost (fyzickou i psychickou) v extrémních podmínkách. Proto se někteří lidé vydávají na nebezpečné výstupy, po neznámých cestách, do exotických končin. Jiní se rozhodují pro náročnější sportovní výkony.

Dá se říct, že samotný Hospodin má smysl pro takové výkony v extrémních podmínkách. Učedníci zareagovali "akčně": udělali to jediné, co je mohlo zachránit, utekli se k Ježíšovi. Ale to je přece známka víry, ne? Proč je Ježíš pokáral? Zachovali se správně, nebo ne? Ano i ne. Ano - protože se utekli ke Kristu. Ne - protože se nechali pohltit strachem. Paradoxně... vody nepohltily loďku, ale strach pohltil učedníky! Naštěstí ne tak úplně. Oni se totiž nenechali zcela ochromit, protože našli sílu k činu. Jejich víra byla částečně ochromená (proto výtky "ještě nemáte víru?"), ale ne tak úplně (jinak by se vůbec neobrátili na Krista).

Nemusíme na galilejské jezero, abychom vyzkoušeli svou víru (přesněji - abychom vyzkoušeli Pána, zda nás vytáhne z nebezpečí). I když jsme nikdy nezažili situaci, kdy voda tekla do naší loďky (na moři či na jezeře), nemusíme "závidět" apoštolům jejich jedinečnou zkušenost. Vždyť i my někdy prožíváme chvíle, kdy nám teče... do bot. Životní drama chystá každému z nás "extrémní situace", kdy můžeme podlehnout vodám, anebo zvítězit nad valícím se mořem. Tyto extrémní situace jsou velmi cenné. Ukazují totiž, co je v nás (třeba hluboko zasuté).

Teach us the sanctity of human love; show us the value of the Domestic Church; and help us to live in peace with all people, that we may share in your life forever. With the intercession of St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church, we ask this through Christ the Lord. Amen.

Young people are a gift from God. The Gospel of Matthew demonstrates the special place that young people have with God. It says: "Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these (Mat. 19:13-15).'" Children contribute to the good of the family. They bring love and vitality to their families, as well as grow in and share faith with their families. They also learn Christian discipleship from their parents and contribute to helping their parents grow in holiness through mutual affection, love and forgiveness (cf. CCC 2225-2229). As children grow into youth and young adulthood, they grow in faith according to their various stages in life, and are called to share in Christ's mission at each stage. In his Apostolic Exhortation *Christus Vivit*, Pope Francis states: "Filled with the love of Christ, young people are called to be witnesses of the Gospel wherever they find themselves, by the way they live (CV 175)." We can look to the lives of young people as examples of what it means to rely on our parents for our basic needs. As children of God, we rely on the love and mercy of our heavenly father as we grow in holiness throughout our lives. In what ways is God a father to you?
