Dear friends in Christ,

Thank you to all who helped feed and who visited with the four seminarians of the Diocese of Austin the past two weeks. They enjoyed being here at our parish and are very appreciative of the hospitality you extended to them. Please keep them in your prayers as they continue their studies and formation for the priesthood.

Next Sunday we will celebrate the Fourth of July, Independence Day. Many of the freedoms and liberties that hundreds of thousands of people died for since the foundation of our great country have slowly been chipped away over the last 50 years or so. Our Church is asking us to pray that these freedoms and liberties be protected so that we, our children, our grandchildren and generations to come, can enjoy the freedoms and liberties that men and women have died for so that we can have a better life. As we celebrate this Fourth of July please pray especially for Respect for all Life, from the first moment of conception to natural death, for defense of marriage as God intends it to be, and, for Religious Freedom, that we may be able to live and profess our faith without worry of being fined or jailed. These are God-given rights and freedoms. We pray that our President and legislatures will always have the courage to defend these rights and freedoms.

In today's Gospel we have two healing stories in one. While Jesus is on His way to heal the daughter of Jairus a woman touches His clothes and was immediately healed. However, Jairus' daughter in the meantime dies. Speaking to the woman who touched Him Jesus says, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction." Jesus knew that the woman really believed in Him. Then, as they are still talking, people come to tell Jesus that Jairus' daughter has died. Jesus tells them "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He goes to Jairus' house along with Peter, James and John and brings her back to life. We need to remind ourselves of Jesus' words, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." In every difficult situation in life Jesus wants us to know that He is with us and that with His help we will get through it. It takes faith and a desire to want to do what Jesus wants for us in our life. Always be comforted by the fact that Jesus is with you, that He loves you, He gives you all you need. Just try to be faithful to Him and trust in Him.

Myšlenky: Čteme-li Písmo, čteme často také o neuvěřitelných, vyjímečných skutečnostech. A můžeme být také fascinováni nebo vše odmítat. Ani jeden z obou postojů nám ale nepomůže. Potřebujeme se totiž v prvé řadě ptát, co příběh znamená. Chtít mu porozumět. A chtít mu porozumět tak, jak byl myšlen, když byl psán, ne tak, jak bych si ho představoval dnes já. A můžeme jít ještě dál. V evangeliu nejde jen o porozumění příběhu, ale jde o porozumění Ježíši. Jemu je především třeba porozumět - teď jako tehdy. Toto porozumění není ale tak obtížné.

Příběhy evangelií nám jako názorné obrazy ukazují, že Ježíš opravdu přemáhá zlo. Že toto zlo je sice mocné, ale není mocnější než Ježíš. A zlo, o kterém se v evangeliu mluví, je zpravidla jediné zlo, než o kterém stále dnes stále referují noviny a televize. Není to především zlo, ohrožující člověka zvenku, je to zlo, které ho ohrožuje zevnitř. I ve chvíli, kdy Ježíš uzdravuje nemoc, očima pozorovatelný defekt člověka, jde vždy také o uzdravení nitra. Jde především o uzdravení nitra - pro život s Bohem, pro život v Božím království. A toto uzdravení víru předpokládá a také víru působí. Jinými slovy: vede k úzkému důvěryplnému vztahu s Ježíšem. A ten lze nabýt dnes, jako tehdy. A víra je pro něj potřebná dnes, jako tehdy. (Pastorace.cz)
