

Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! Last week we met with a couple of contractors to reassign Phases I & II of our project. K4 Construction of Waco has been awarded the project. We will provide more information and a timeline for the project once we have met with the contractor to finalize the contract.

It is getting hotter each week! Please remember to dress appropriately for Mass. No shorts please! Let us come to Mass dressed for the One we come to worship...the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords.

In today's Gospel it is written, "When he (Jesus) disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things." Also, in today's first reading from the Prophet Jeremiah it is written, "Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock of my pasture, says the Lord." Jeremiah is warning the shepherds, the religious leaders of his day, that they have led the people astray and are not teaching what should be taught. They have given into the ways of the world and the likes of the people and no longer speak the Truth of God. This was happening not only at the time of Jeremiah, but also at the time of Jesus. This is happening in our own day as well. So many pastors, preachers and even priests and religious sisters are not teaching the Truth but instead are giving into the mindset of people today who want to hear that they can say and do anything they want and still go to heaven. These are not faithful shepherds of the flock. They are leading the sheep into the midst of wolves and the devil is very happy about it all as he is stealing many souls for himself. If you want to know if someone's preaching and teaching is authentic and correct, read the Catechism of the Catholic Church and the Bible to see if their preaching and teaching is according to what the Church really teaches and what the Church has taught for the past two thousand years. If the teaching is in conflict with what the Catholic Church is teaching, then it is not of God, but of the evil one. It is to Peter whom Jesus gave the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven and it is to Peter whom Jesus told that the gates of hell would not prevail against it (the Church). For some people this is difficult to accept. But, it is what Jesus has told and revealed to us in the Bible, and Jesus is the Truth, the Way and the Life. Either we accept what He has said or we reject it and do as we please. So many people are doing as they please and are rejecting the message of Jesus in the name of tolerance, or what they say is compassion. Allowing people to do wrong and to allow them to go down the road to hell is not compassion. May we have the assistance of the Holy Spirit to help us to always proclaim the Truth and the courage we need to live the Truth so that souls may be converted to the true love of Jesus.

K úvaze: Opět Ježíš s lidskou tváří - vždyť jak "obyčejně" zní "pojďte stranou si odpočinout", "bylo mu jich líto"! Je možná nezvyklé, že Ježíš takhle hovoří, ne? Takové obyčejné věty, které by mohly pocházet od "jakéhokoli" člověka. A přece tato slova nejsou tak banální, jak se na první pohled může jevit. Vezměme tu první větu - "pojďte stranou si odpočinout". Nemá to však být pouhý odpočinek, ale odpočinek "s Ježíšem". V jeho blízkosti. A to radikálně mění situaci. Anebo druhou větu - "bylo mu jich líto". Ježíš se však nezastavil u pocitů, udělal něco konkrétního - začal učit. A to je zarážející, ne? Zatímco lidé byli chtiví zázraků, viditelných znamení, Kristus místo toho nabízí... slova. Ano, nabízí slova - nejsou to však slova, slova a jen slova. O Ježíšových slovech totiž paradoxně platí... že to nejsou slova! "On neučí jako učitelé zákona, ale jako ten, kdo má moc" - jako ten, který ukazuje cestu tam, kde je tma tmoucí. Nabízí odpočinutí tam, kde lidé (a učitelé zákona) umí vkládat jen neúnosná břemena. Jeho slovo láme okovy hříchů ("opakujících se") a nepřemožitelných závislostí (pouhým slovem jsou vyhnány temné mocnosti). Ježíšova slova... nejsou slova. A ubohý ten, kdo nepoznal, že Ježíš je někdo víc než moudrý učitel "životní moudrosti". Anebo - šťastný ten, kdo tuší, že Ježíš nabízí víc než slova. (Pastorace.cz)
