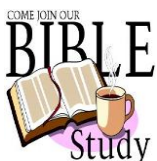

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. This week we celebrate some important feast days: Tuesday, August 24 - St. Bartholomew; Friday, August 27 - St. Monica; Saturday, August 28 - St. Augustine. Try to attend Mass on these days to honor these important saints and to ask for their intercession.

Today's Gospel ends the Bread of Life Discourse in the Gospel of John that we have been reading from for the last few weeks. The Gospel begins with John 6:60 with the verse "Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, 'This saying is hard; who can accept it?'" And then later in this section it says: "As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him." Jesus words are very clear, but yet so many still do not accept His words and therefore do not receive the Body and Blood of our Lord. They have walked away from this teaching of Jesus. Let us pray that our faith is always strong enough to accept all that Jesus has given us to believe and that we will give faithful witness to what we believe. Thank you Lord Jesus for faith in your Real Presence in the Holy Communion we receive.

On two of the last three Sundays I spoke of how we should show proper reverence to the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist as we celebrate Mass and as He is reposed in the tabernacle. We do that by the attention we give Jesus during Mass. We reverence Jesus by the way we dress for Mass. That is why we should always dress appropriately, never wearing shorts to Mass. We reverence Jesus by being on time for Mass, never being late. We reverence Jesus when we come into to this church when before entering the pew we genuflect to His presence here in the tabernacle. We show proper reverence to Him in how we come to receive Holy Communion by being careful to either make an altar to the Lord with our hands or by receiving Jesus on the tongue. We reverence Jesus at Mass by staying with Him to the end, never leaving Mass right after Holy Communion and staying until the final prayer after our Recessional Song. Let us show Jesus we truly love His presence here and may we all remain faithful to the Bread of Life.
