

Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace and love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all.

Today's readings speak to us about the necessity of keeping God's commandments and not just paying lip-service to God. His commandments must become part of who we are as Christians. We must live the commandments. Do we take the commandments to heart and put them into action? Are we just being show-offs when it comes to our faith? Jesus tells us that such things as evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly are things that defile us. Do any of these sins describe us in some way? If so, let us go to confession and ask God for forgiveness and try to live in a way that is in keeping of the commandments. St. James tells us in the second reading that we are to "be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding ourselves." He continues stating "religion that is pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained by the world." It is a difficult challenge to keep oneself unstained by the world. The ways of the world and the sinfulness of others seem to impose themselves upon us. But by God's grace and our response to His grace we can live a life in a way as it is described in today's readings. Remember, God is with you always. Just make sure you are with Him.

K ZAMYŠLÉNÍ: Církev je vnímána jako instituce zachovávající dávné tradice. Kde je hranice mezi mechanickým, bezduchým ulpěním na stále stejném a mezi skutky, symboly a myšlenkami oživenými v aktuální situaci mocí Božího ducha? Nejednou se ukazuje, že zachovávání tradic je vlastně formou útěku do jistoty před ohrožujícím světem stále nového rozhodování se. Opakem je potřeba mít něco stále jinak, nezvykle, být hlavně jiní než ostatní... Ježíš dává návod: Duchovní kvalitu nedává tradice, zvyk, móda..., ale to, co je skutečnou příčinou našeho jednání, tedy co motivuje jednání v našem srdci.

Na druhou stranu všechny "naše osobní" tradice a zbožné zvyky jsou do určité míry nutné, protože vytvářejí pevný rámec, bez kterého je náš vztah k Bohu "neurčitý" a vágní. Avšak "láska k Kristu" nám velí, klást na první místo vždycky Boží slovo, a ne "naše zvyky". "Láska ke Kristu" nám přikazuje, neustále revidovat naši osobní "tradici" ve světle evangelia. A tato "revize" je v zásadě "obrácením", trvalým postojem naslouchání Bohu a jeho slovu. Je to Samuelův postoj: "Mluv, Pane, řekni své slovo k tomu, co žiji, jak se modlím, jak se věnuji druhým". The Eucharist lies at the heart of our Catholic faith. The Catechism of the Catholic Church calls the Eucharist the "source and summit of the Christian life (CCC 1324)." The preeminence of the Eucharist in our faith points to the crucial role that the Eucharist plays in living a Christian life. As members of Christ's body, we are a Eucharistic people. We are strengthened in grace through receiving Christ in the Eucharist. We are then called to go forth to love and serve others as Christ did.
