

In today's Second Reading and the Gospel we see a change in the way people were treated in Jesus' time. St. James tells us in Second Reading that all people are to be treated with respect and dignity, no matter how rich or poor they may be. We cannot show favoritism to anyone when seeing them as brothers and sisters in the Lord. In the Gospel people bring a deaf man, who also had difficulty speaking, to Jesus. Jesus brings him healing by touching the man's ears and his tongue. Jesus reaches out to this man who most people would have avoided even coming close to him. Jesus continually teaches us to reach out to those in need, to those who are less fortunate than we, to bring them healing and to improve their situation in life. Just as the man in today's Gospel was bound by his deafness and his inability to speak, we are often restricted in our ability to function normally do to illness, especially spiritual illness. Physical illness impairs our bodies, while spiritual illness, sin, impairs our soul. Jesus wants to free us from our sinfulness so that we can be free to live life in its fullness and therefore assist in completing the building of the Kingdom of God here on earth. May we go to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) often and be freed from all that binds us.
