

Sept. 12 - 19: Andrew & Susan Klepac Sept. 19 - 26: Louis & Louise Straka **2nd Collection for Haiti and the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, Louisiana-** On August 14th a 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck Haiti killing nearly 1300 people, leaving thousands without shelter and many communities in need of resources. Haiti is still recovering from the disastrous earthquake a decade ago and many people continue face food insecurity and severe drought. Haiti *also recently* experienced the recent tropical storm Grace adding to the humanitarian disaster. Closer to home, our brothers and sisters in South Louisiana have endured Hurricane Ida, significantly damaging every parish and school community in the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux. It will take months if not years for these communities to rebuild. This weekend Bishop Vásquez asks that a 2nd collection be taken up for these relief efforts. He has decided that 50% of this collection will go to helping the people of South Louisiana, specifically the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, and 50% will be sent to the US Bishops' *Emergency Disaster Fund*, to benefit the people of Haiti. *May God bless you for your generosity*.

Elite Medical Imaging (EMI) will be here on Saturday, October 2, in the RE Bldg, to provide our annual **Preventive Ultrasound Health Screening**. Ultrasound screenings are painless, non-invasive and contain no radiation. Eight preventive screenings will be offered: carotid artery, abdominal aorta, thyroid, liver, spleen, gallbladder and both kidneys. These screenings are not typically done at doctor's visits or at annual checkups, nor will insurance companies pay for them, unless you are symptomatic. Screenings will be offered to you for \$49 each or the full package, (all 8 areas) for just

\$150.00! Flex spending accounts may be used, and all other forms of payment are accepted the day of the screening. Their radiologist recommends these screenings be considered on an annual basis as a preventive measure. Oftentimes, results can change from one year to the next based on age, stress factors and lifestyle. Appointments are required and will be offered on a first come first serve basis. An EMI representative will also be here the weekend of September 25/26, offering pre-registration and to answer any questions. In today's readings St. James tells us that faith without works is dead. There is no such thing as a "faith alone" salvation. Sacred Scripture makes this very clear. Faith and works must go together if we are to truly be followers of Jesus. In the Gospel today St. Peter makes a profession of faith as he tells Jesus, "You are the Christ." Even as he makes this bold profession of faith his human nature tries to interfere with his faith as he does not want to see Jesus suffer and die. The same is true in today's day and time for us as we struggle with our human nature and many times think only as human beings do and not as God. May our faith sustain us in these struggles against what is true and what is according to the ways of God.
