Annual Cemetery Dues: The contribution, per family, of at least \$20, can be turned in using a 'Cemetery Dues' envelope (located by the bulletins or in your contribution envelope box). As written in our Cemetery Policies & Procedures: "Annual contributions of at least \$20 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance. Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! **October is the month of the Rosary.** Please pray the rosary with your family each day and experience a new life in Jesus.

Our Parish Mission is scheduled for November 14-18. Please mark your calendars to reserve this week to attend. It will be a great way to prepare oneself for the holiday season.

October is also Respect Life Month. Pray for respect for life in all its stages, from natural conception to natural death. People wonder why there are so many shootings in our country in our day and time. It is because there is a lack of respect for life. People do not see each human being as being made in the image and likeness of God. They do not see each person as being sacred. Since it is legal to kill babies in the womb through abortion, many people also see it as ok to kill anyone who becomes an inconvenience to them. One mortal sin leads to another. Pray that life may be respected in our country once again.

In today's Gospel Jesus stresses the importance of keeping the Ten Commandments. The rich young man could not let go of his riches and material possessions in order to follow Jesus. Like the rich young man many people of today cannot let go of sins that are causing them not to be faithful to Jesus. These sins may include greed, selfishness, sinful relationships, living together before marriage, fornication, birth control, drunkenness, drugs, pride, and many other sins. If we are involved in these sins, then we are not keeping the commandments and we are not really following Jesus, we are only following ourselves. Let us say "yes" to Jesus and "no" to these other things that separate us from our Lord and from one another.

Bylo by ztrapňující přiznat si, že nějaká "maličkost" nás drží v poutech. Evangelium nám však dává odvahu k pravdě - a ke svobodě. Vždyť Kristus nabízí pomocnou ruku všem "závislým" - naléhavě volá, že je tu Někdo, kdo je mocný... nás vytrhnout z moci majetku. Je tu Někdo, kdo je mocný, i když my jsme bezmocní... a jednoduše závislí.

Teach us the sanctity of human love; show us the value of the Domestic Church; and help us to live in peace with all people, that we may share in your life forever. The witness of marriage is a witness of the love that Christ has for his bride, the Church. From the beginning to the end of scripture, we see the importance of marriage.
